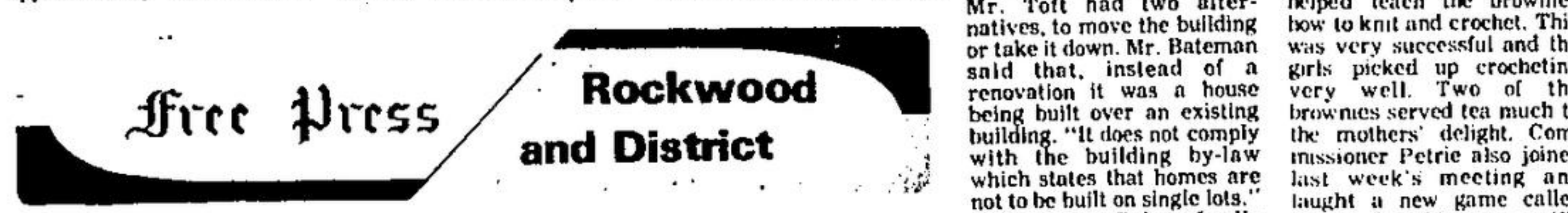
GUARD is busy
