



During the Summer School and Festival of the Arts from July 8 to August 18, Sheridan will offer accommodation, meals, camping, transportation, day care, library services, air-conditioning, theatre tent and sidewalk cafe.

Don't miss this chance to become involved in one of the largest programs put on by Sheridan College.

Sheridan College intends to utilize the college's facilities to the fullest this summer, through the establishment of a new program entitled Summer School and Festival of the Arts.

The program begins July 8 and will offer a variety of courses in the arts.

About 90 per cent of the courses carry a credit value.

One of the most interesting aspects of the proposal is a festival which will feature day and evening events in a scheme called "Performance". Some of these activities include theatre, music-theatre, films, concerts, recitals, displays and workshops. It will be open to students, staff and the general public.

Following is a brief summary of some of the highlights planned for the summer of 1974.

PERFORMING ARTS provides an opportunity for persons to be participants or consumers. It will feature the Whiteoaks Festival Choir and a number of leading groups and individuals such as the Chamber Choir, Gladys Whitehead, of the Royal Hamilton College of Music, Berkley School of Jazz; Robert Doyle and Jackson Turner who will conduct workshops in set design, costumes and properties.

VISUAL ARTS includes workshops and courses in design, drawing, painting, photography, soap stone carving and watercolor.

APPLIED AND LIBERAL ARTS features a number of special interest courses ranging from gourmet barbecue cooking and yoga to religion and futuristic studies. Noted psychologist Dr. Howard Eisenberg will conduct a parapsychology workshop.

COMMUNICATION ARTS presents various levels of studies in cartooning, film, sound production, public speaking, wordcraft and writing.

CHILDREN'S WORLD makes available arts and crafts, creative play, games and music for children, as well as courses for parents on the topic of children.

PHYSICAL ARTS offers recreational and instructional activities including archery, golf, hiking, jogging, and riding.

WORKSHOPS will be given in astrology, science fiction, sensory awareness, sexuality, and human relations. A special writers workshop planned for August 9 and 10, will include well-known writers, panels and discussions on topics such as writing for Canadian and U.S. Markets, manuscripts, interviewing and research techniques, book writing.

THE FESTIVAL itself is an integral part of the summer program. It will feature music theatre; films, including a silent series with Horace Lapp at the piano; the BBC "Ascent of man" series; musicals of the 30's and 40's; a Shakespeare series, Disney cartoon series and a festival of student films.

Other areas include drama, concerts (choral, classical, folk and rock), lectures, and theatre and interest tours (Shaw Festival, Melody Fair, Tanglewood).
