council chambers, the chairman's suite and an industrial commission. Public works, the land division committee, planning department and the legal

department will be on the fourth floor. The region is leasing space from Peter Lush Associates at \$440,328 per year. While employees have much more space than they had at the Steeles Ave. building, it appears that the space will be basic office accommodation in a functional but not cla-

borate setting. Halton's former administration building was sold to the provincial government for court and registry office use. The Burlington regional headquarters is leased for three years while a new permanent home is being located or built.

Dispose of machines

The finance committee of Halton Hills council has recommended unused duplicating and copying equipment, a legacy from the amalgamation of three municipal offices, be disposed of and new equipment leased which will do a

more efficient job. Clerk Doug Pritchard told the committee the operation of the town offices depended on the smooth flow of copying work. More than 17,000 copies had been made for the month of January alone --- all for internal use.

"We'll have to purchase a paper mill if we keep that quipped Councillor

Ernie Sykes. Treasurer Lloyd Peterson pointed out the monthly rental of machines costs more than the three copiers recommended as

replacements. Placing of the machines will be determined by the greatest volume of work. They will be placed in the old Esquesing and Georgetown offices. No copiers are needed in the Acton office.

A Halton grand jury report indicated the need for better staff accommodation at Halton County Jail.

The report indicated a need for painting the lunchroom and replacing a tollet in the nurse's room. The centuryold building has been the subject of criticism by a series of grand juries. The facility will eventually be replaced by a new modern iall to be built in conjunction 76041 . with the Maplehurst complex.
