Want increase in age limit

Representatives of Junior "C" and Junior "D" teams in the OHA are pressing to have the age limit for their categories extended from 20 to 21 years of age.

At Saturday's OHA annual meeting in Toronto, retiring President Frank Doherty promised to call team representatives together again to see what they wish to do if an OHA motion asking that the age limit be increased is lost at next month's CAHA meeting in Winnipeg.

Founded Georgetown little N.H.L.

Gordon Alcott passes suddenly

Founder of the Little NHL minor hockey program and a man who influenced the lives and careers of hundreds of young people, Gordon Alcott died of an apparent heart attack Thursday at the age of 65.

Gordon founded the Little NHL in Georgetown in 1938 with six teams, all carrying National Hockey League nicknames. Players were

named after NHL greats of the era like Charlie Conacher and carried that player's name on their sweater.

Boys signed a series of contracts, which Gordon drew up and which indicated that in order to play under the National League they had to leave tobacco alone and be off the streets by a reasonable hour. Although the initial aim of the league was directed to

the teaching of hockey, its more subtle objective was to make good youngsters of the players and to impress upon them that they could not smoke cigarettes and loaf the streets half the night and still be good hockey players or good at anything.

Born in Mount Dennis in 1909, Gordon was a lay minister for more than 30 years. He preached at about

1500 services and led a Young People's group at the Presbyterian Church in Erin where he was residing at the time of his death.

Gordon and wife Jean willingly responded to a request that they form a softball league for boys 8 to 14 in the "shamrock village" when they moved there a number of years ago.

A private family service was held Friday night at the Waddell Funeral Chapel in Erin and cremation followed Saturday morning. A memorial service was

held in Erin Presbyterian Church last night (Tuesday) and a second is planned for the Presbyterian Church in Weston this Sunday at 2:30 p.m.

Besides his wife Jean, Gordon leaves his mother Mrs. Lillian Alcott of Georgetown, one brother Ernie of Port Colborne and five sisters, Mrs. Lillian Marchmont of Norval, Mrs. Edith Hillier of Georgetown, Mrs. Ethel King of Georgetown, Mrs. Dorothy Wright of Georgetown and Miss Florence Alcott of Georgetown. He was predeceased by his father George, March 14, 1956.
