A series of grass fires in the Acton vicinity have kept the Halton Hills fire brigade busy and Fire Chief Mick Holmes reports three in the district since the date of April 21. A grass fire occurred at the residence of D. Greenly of R.R. 1, with the alarm called in at 2:05 p.m. It was quelled quickly.

On April 26 at 1:55 p.m. another grass fire was reported by Mrs. J. Johnson at her home, R.R. 1, Acton, also extinguished.

Six-thirty p.m. was the hour when a neighbor reported a grass fire at the home of Mr. Leuschner, R.R. 1. The brigade hurriedly handled the blaze.

The Acton fire brigade was alerted last Friday, April 26 at 4:25 a.m.

A car, owned by Wayne Wilson of R.R. 5, Rockwood had back-fired when he was

driving, and burst into flames.

The Acton men quickly quelled the flames. Damage to the 1967 Cadillac was not estimated, only wires were burned off.

Wm. McPhedran dies after lengthy illness

Funeral services were held on April 10 for William McPhedran, R.R. 1, Acton, who died at the Guelph General Hospital on April 6 after a year-long illness.

Born on his grandfather's (John Frank's) farm, on May 17, 1914, William McPhedran was married in Campbellville on Jan. 31, 1940, to Charlotte with whom he resided at the family home address all his lifetime.

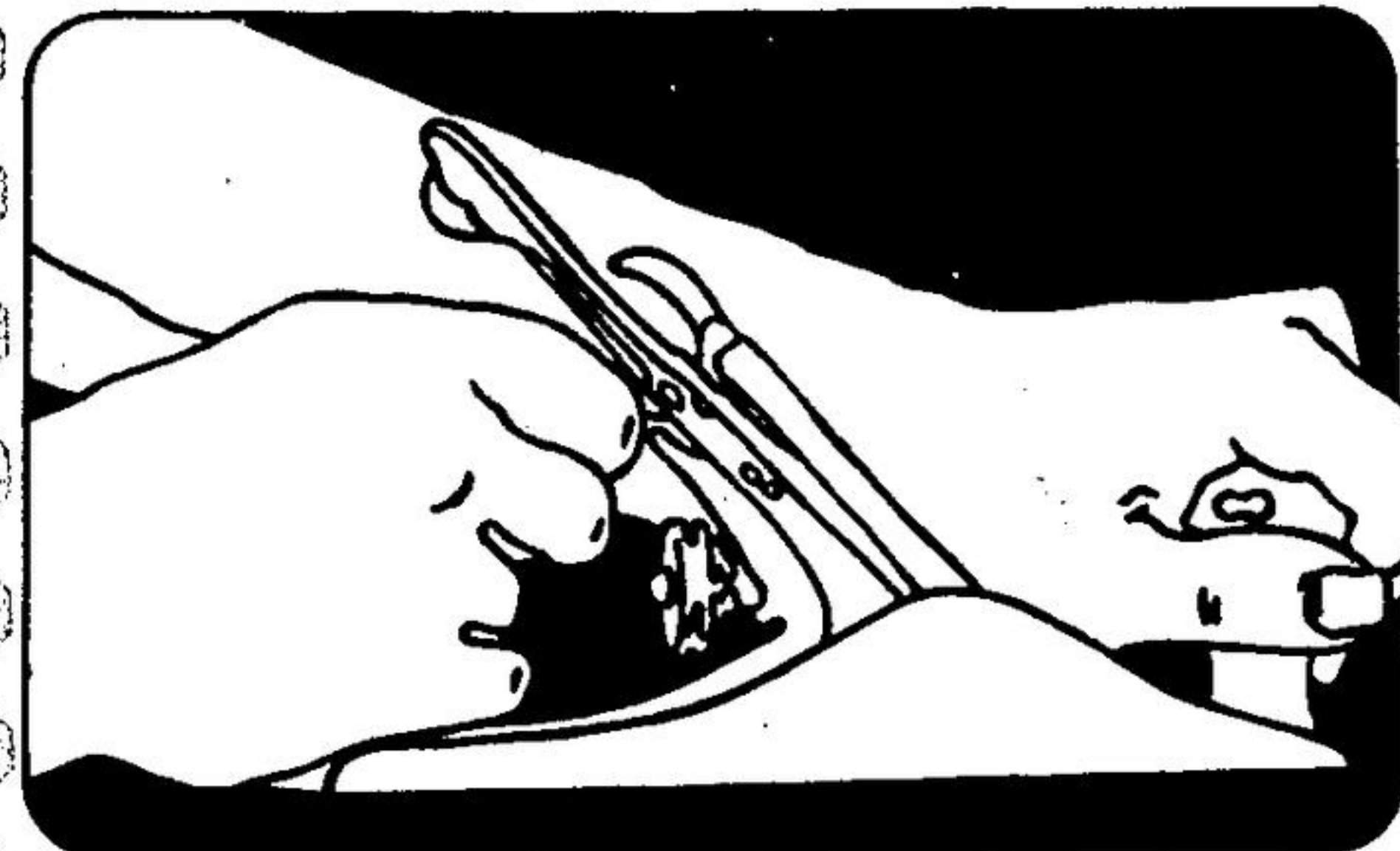
Folk mass

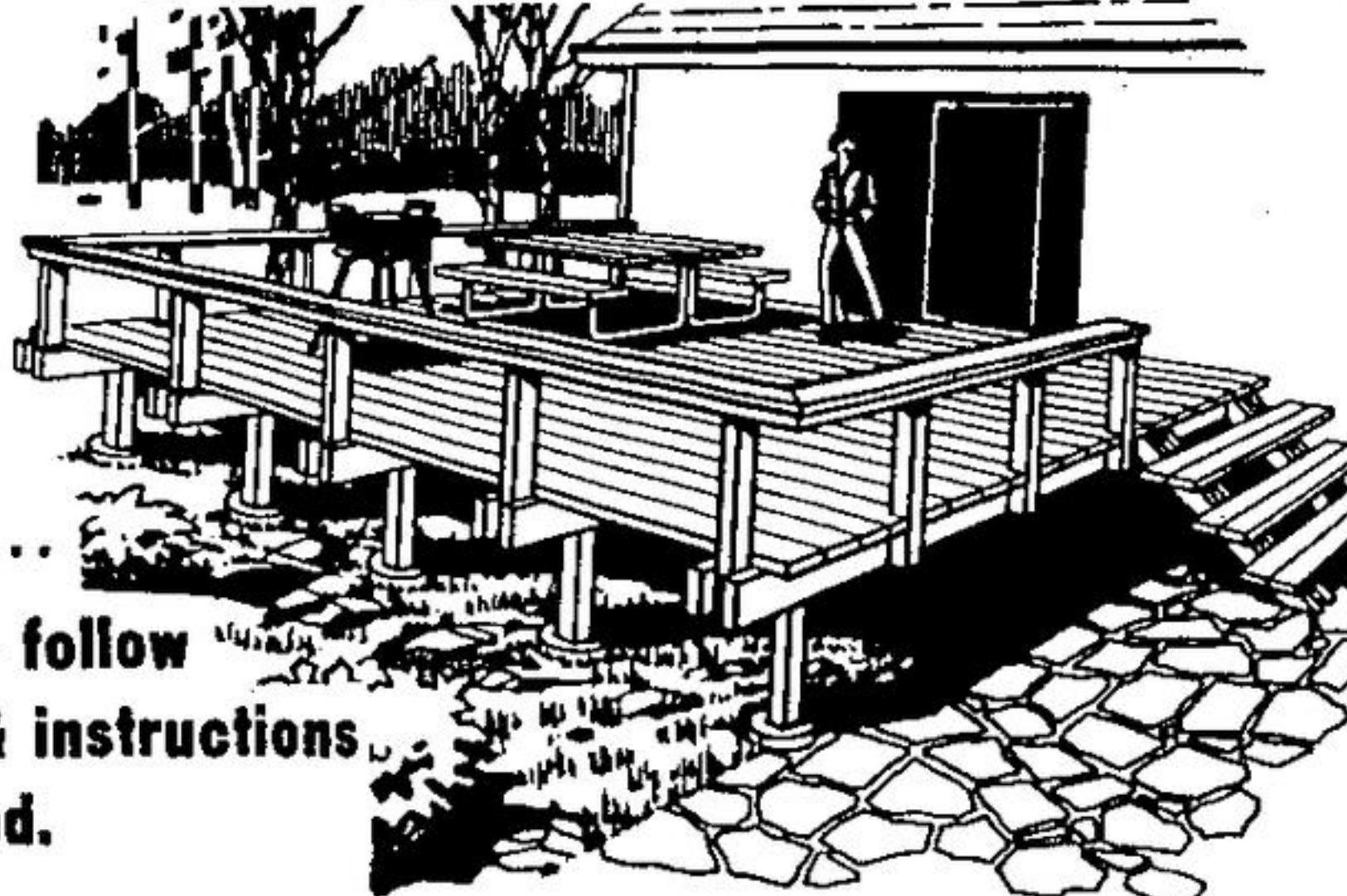
Playing guitars were Mrs. Nellie Pitt, Karen and Alex Pitt. (Lead guitarist Les Duby was in hospital).

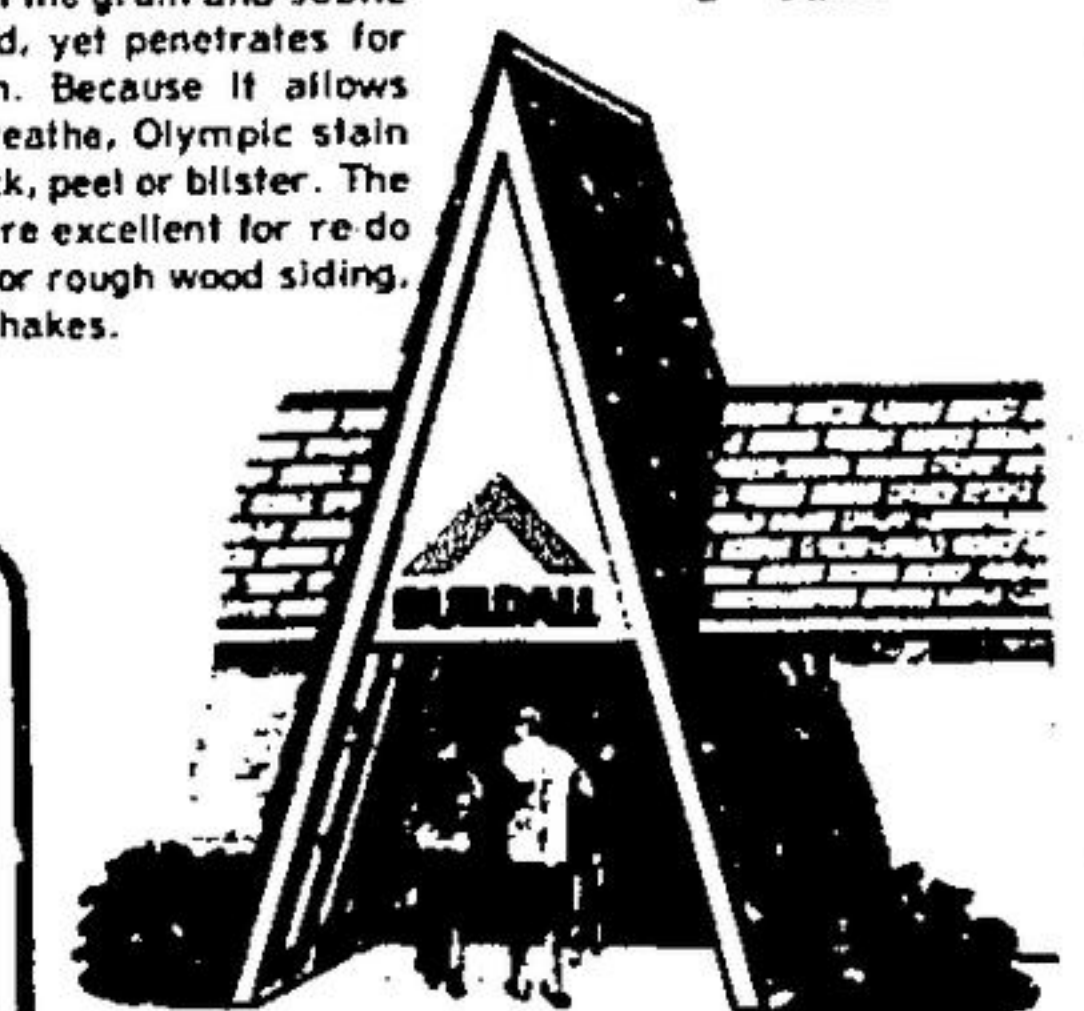
