## Halton rural league accepts Acton entries

Seven teams from Acton have been accepted into the Halton Rural Minor Softball league for the 1974 season which will begin for most teams the week of May 20.

A switch from baseball to softball in the Acton Minor Baseball Association was followed by a request from Acton that they be allowed to enter their first year teams in the league, which is made up almost entirely of rural communities.

President John Haines of Glen Williams announced this week that Glen Williams, Hornby, Lowville, Omagh, Limehouse and Acton will each have an entry in the boys' atom (under 9), squirt (under 11) and pee-wee (13 and under) divisions.

The boys' bantam league will be made up of two teams from Lowville and one each from the Glen, Hornby, Omagh and Acton. Lowville, Glen Williams, Omagh, Hornby, Inglewood and Guelph have entered teams in the

midget league.

Since there were not enough entries in the Tri-county league, Rockwood and Aberfoyle have been accepted into the Halton Rural juvenile league along with Lowville, Hornby, Glen Williams, Erin, Guelph and Acton.

Lowville, Glen Williams, Limehouse and Hornby will make up the newly-formed girls' squirt (under 9) league. A six team girls' pee-wee (under 12) league will have entries from Lowville, Hornby, Omagh, Limehouse, Glen Williams and Acton. All

of these communities except Limehouse have entered the girls' bantam (under 16) league.

President Haines estimates there will be approximately 700 youngsters playing minor softball in the Halton Rural league this summer. Last year the league produced three Ontario Rural champions, Hornby midgets and juveniles and Glen Williams' bantams.

Doug Lariche of Omagh is vice-president of the league and Joan Coulson of Lowville is back again in the position of Secretary-treasurer.
