

Want all dogs, cats at clinic

By May 14, Dr. E.R. Earl hopes as many as possible of the dogs and cats in Halton will be vaccinated against rabies. Clinics, sponsored by the Animal Health Branch of the Department of Agriculture, began this morning (Wednesday) in Lowville and will continue at various locations in the county until next Tuesday.

Dr. Earl is head veterinarian at the Brampton District office of Animal Health, and notes most infection is present in foxes and skunks. Vaccination of family pets will act as a barrier between wild animals and the human

population of the county, he said.

The clinics are for dogs and cats only and will be held at the following locations:

Thursday, May 9 at the Municipal Garage in Nassagaweya and the Orange Hall in Hornby from 10 a.m. to 12 noon; at the Arena Community Centre in Acton from 2 to 6 p.m., and the Municipal

Garage in Georgetown from 3 to 7 p.m.

Monday, May 13, at Trafalgar Memorial Hall in Oakville from 1:30 to 7:30.

Owners are requested to keep pets on a leash at the clinics, and are advised that the animals should be at least two months old. All animals should be accompanied by adults.

the municipalities and the province in a three level partnership in the program. She suggested the ministry would be providing incentives for municipalities to have more homes built.

Hope for grants

While finalized details involving financial assistance will not be available for another week or so, some councillors suggested indicated grants would be made available to municipalities to help offset the costs of servicing.

Mrs. Scrivener said the intent would be to cut the red tape involved in subdivision approvals and speed up the approval process.

Warren said the province had allocated \$20,000,000 for initial financing of the program.

Warren was asked if the province would drop plans for the program in any given area where the local or regional council felt more homes wouldn't be of benefit or fit into long range planning.

There will be much discussion with private developers and the municipality and we hope a partnership can be arrived at. We look to the municipalities to accelerate the rate of house building," he said.

"The public has to accept a fair share of the responsibility for housing. Housing is a major social problem. We will succeed in our program," Warren told reporters.

Mrs. Scrivener claimed her ministry did not own any land in the Halton region but noted OHC had banked some land. Regional Chairman Allan Masson had indicated at a press conference that morning that it was common knowledge OHC had purchased about 1,200 acres in the Palermo area.

Councillor Len Cox indicated the program had possibilities but would take careful consideration.

Mrs. Scrivener said Brian Holmes had been named regional co-ordinator for the Halton area.
