Acton man faces charges

An Acton man faces a handful of charges following the theft of two cars the afternoon of his release from a Brampton reformatory.

Gordon Adamson was paroled Thursday. He had been convicted almost two years ago on arson charges following a number of house fires in Acton.

Shortly after his release this week Adamson stole a Chrysler in Toronto and drove to Milton. While speeding down residential James St. the man lost control of the vehicle and slammed into a hydro pole. The pole snapped causing a transformer and hydro wires to topple to the ground.

Adamson drove away from the accident to the Campbellville area where he abandoned the car and stole a truck.

Milton OPP apprehended the man as he walked along a Nassagaweya concession after leaving the truck.

Numerous charges

Adamson is presently in custody facing numerous charges including two counts of auto theft, two counts of dangerous driving and failing to remain at the scene of an accident.

Evaluators viewers get raise

"The best bargain this year," was the way Councillor Ernie Sykes described a two dollar raise from eight to ten dollars a trip, given to livestock evaluators and fence viewers, last week.

Mayor Tom Hill said they had been paid eight dollars a trip for as long as he could remember. "It's ridiculous," added the mayor.

The mayor said there were fewer than ten claims a year for livestock or poultry killed or injured, and rarely a call for fence viewers.

"I guess you city boys don't have fence viewers," said the mayor.

"No, but we have keyhole peepers," shot back Councillor Ric Morrow.

Councillor Ernie Hyde said he felt ten dollars would barely cover the gas.

The mayor assured him they only asked for ten dollars.
