Minority government weak says Kemppling



DISAPPOINTED IN THE LIBERAL GOVERNMENT, Halton-Wentworth MP Bill Kemppling reported the inadequacies of minority government to riding PCs at the nomination meeting last week.

"I am here to tell you minority government is weak government," Progressive Conservative Bill Kemppling said last week as he accepted the uncontested PC nomination for the Halton-Wentworth riding. "It's not good government at all," the incumbent member of parliament said, predicting a country-wide Tory sweep in the upcoming election. Kemppling described the last session of parliament as a pressure cooker, while the House of Commons awaited the Liberal budget. "The last few weeks were very tense because we were waiting for sound anti-inflation measures in the budget," he said, "but there was nothing to indicate the government was going to take hold of this terrible thing eating away at all of us."

government leadership will be the major issue, Kemppling said. His local interests will be housing, economic, such as business interests and municipal housing assistance. Former PC cabinet minister George Hees was guest speaker at the meeting and outlined party inflation policy. "Wage and price controls did succeed in the United States," he emphasized, "because they have kept the cost of living rise down to 3.2 per cent, compared to 10 per cent in Canada." Also confident a majority Conservative government will be elected, Hees indicated a temporary 60-90 day wage and price freeze would be used to "jar people into realizing inflation has got to stop in their own best interests." Then flexible con-

trials would be used to guide the economy, along with a system of production incentives. Hees gave an example of tax points, whereby a company would be granted tax rebates at the end of the year according to how much it contributed to the economy. Kemppling later revealed PC plans for an interest equalization tax which would make up the differential between interest rates in Canada and the United States. This would encourage Canadian investors to keep their money at home, rather than put it in American markets where the interest rate is higher. Hees said there was a need for more businessmen in the House of Commons and fewer intellectuals, teachers, and

farmers. MPP George Kerr gave a short address and hinted at the possibility of a cabinet portfolio for Kemppling in a Conservative government, in consideration of his background in business.

Eric Cunningham, 25, a public relations consultant from Burlington was selected Liberal candidate for the Halton-Wentworth riding in the federal election. At a meeting and dance in the ballroom of the Burlington Holiday Inn last week, Cunningham was acclaimed after other potential nominees withdrew in his favor. Cunningham made a short acceptance speech, focussing on economic issues. He defended the budget presented by the Liberal government in the House of Commons and criticized the Progressive Conservative calls for wage and price controls. He noted some

retailers have already raised their prices, as protection in the event the PCs should win the July 8 election. Cunningham said implementation of wage and price controls would require increased protectionism to ensure their effectiveness, and he feels the public, especially labor, would not accept this. What is needed, he said, is an increase in the supply of goods and services, with increased income and protection against savings erosion for those on fixed incomes and unable to protect themselves. The riding executive expects two campaign visits to the area by Prime Minister

Trudeau, a Wiener roast with minister of agriculture Eugene Whelan, and a riding dinner with federal Liberal MP Norm Calk as guest speaker.

Two men seeking NDP nomination

Halton NDP will field a candidate in the July 8 federal election race Thursday, May 30. Party officials this week announced the nomination convention will be held at the UAW Hall on Martin St. in Milton, beginning at 8 p.m. And so far the NDP members have two nominees from which to choose - Archie Brown of Speyvale who owns a furniture store in Mississauga, and a 43-year-old Sheridan College student Don Wackley who is president of the community college's student senate. Wackley lives on Bell School Line and cites his interest in education plus his eight years as an officer in a United Auto Workers union

as among his credentials. A media arts student at Sheridan, he is a former president of the riding NDP association. Guest speaker for the nomination convention has yet to be announced. Halton Liberals sent Dr. Frank Philbrook of Oakville into the federal race two weeks ago, and incumbent MP Terry O'Connor was again nominated to contest the Halton riding for the Progressive Conservatives.
