Station wagon for Acton chief

Mick Holmes, Fire Chief Area 1, (Acton) may have a new vehicle, but not exactly the same as the one bought by the town for Ken Buikema, Fire Chief Area 2.

Mr. Holmes is receiving a car allowance and using his own car at present. He told general administration his car was old and the garage bills were high. He said his wife drove and it would be more convenient to have a town vehicle.

He suggested a station wagon, rather than the four wheel drive type, driven by Mr. Buikema. Mr. Holmes said a station wagon was about \$1000 cheaper than the Bronco, four wheel drive.

He said he needed a new family car, and didn't want to use it for fire services.

Councillor Les Duby asked if the budget could be juggled to allow for the \$1,500 expenditure.

The committee approved the purchase, provided it was included in the fire budget.

Fire Chief Holmes indicated he didn't want a yellow station wagon, but preferred the traditional red.
