### More nails investigated

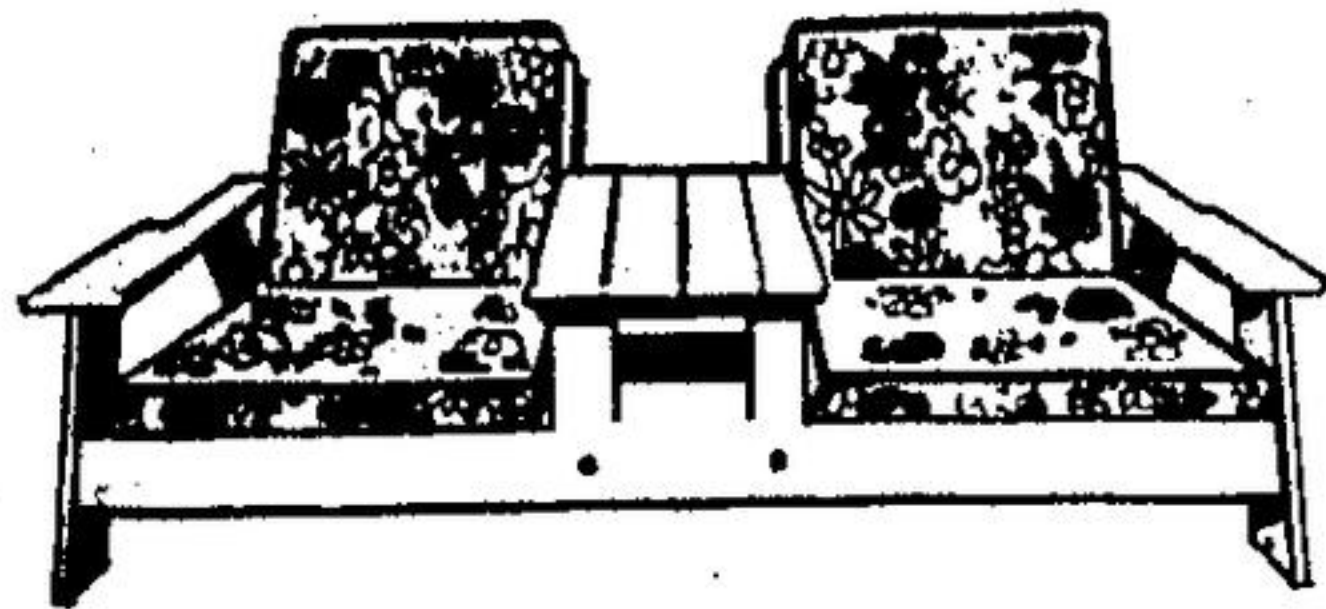
