






IN 1898 the fire brigade posed in front of the town hall with their pride and Joy—their steam fire engine. It was purchased in the 1890's and kept till the last war when it was sold for needed scrap. It hast served in 1924 at a big Beardmore fire. Delay was a problem; after the firelighters reached the fire hall the fire had to be kindled and then the gear had to be hauled by horses or men to one of the half-dozen sources of water available. The hose was carried on extra reels. Once steam was up the streams of water would rip shingles or siding off buildings and smash in glass windows, to the delight of all but the owner of the building. Often water damage was as great as fire damage. But no fire got completely out of hand and no sections of the village were ever wiped out.
