TO THE LEFT is Private Victor John Lane, Private Jack Large and Private Alf Winterburn. These men enlisted at Acton West, Ont. in August 1914 for the 4th battalion, the 1st contingent. They were in Regiment No. 133304. Pte. Alf Winterburn was killed in France. Pte. Lane served at Ypres and Paschendale and was transferred to B.C. Horse, at Valcartier 5th Battalion. He died at Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto and is buried at Prospect Cemetery, Toronto, grave No. 4035, section 7. Pte. Large was a Boer War veteran.
