# Along the Bruce Trail

Through the woods and over the hills winds the Bruce Trail through the Terra Cotta Conservation Area is just one of the many conservation and forest tracts on the trail. The area consists of 350 acres including forests, four stocked ponds for fishing enthusiasts, camp sites, swimming and picnicking facilities. Also in the park is a nature trail which winds more than a mile through rocky, forested terrain. The trail also crosses the Bruce Trail a number of times on its course through the Terra Cotta
