

# Rams lead round robin face showdown at Orillia

Acton Rams are unbeaten following their first three games in a four team OLA Junior 'C' round robin playoff series which will declare one winner to advance to the Central group lacrosse semi-finals.

Rams walloped Long Branch PCOs 10-6 in Long Branch last Wednesday night, upset Orillia Lions for the first time this year 12-8 in Acton the next night and knocked off Long Branch for the second time 10-10 in Acton Monday night.

Huntsville Hawks, the fourth team in the round robin face the Rams in a big series this weekend. The teams play in Huntsville Saturday night and back in Acton Sunday night at 7.

Final game of the round robin and the one which will probably decide the winner is in Orillia Wednesday, August 14 between the Lions and Rams. Orillia is expected to win all its games against Long Branch and Huntsville, making that game the showdown.

Hot tricks by Jim Chisholm, George Artem and Paul Wilson sparked the Acton win in the series opener. Del Watson netted a pair of goals, while Bruce Cooksley, Wayne Young, Gary Fisher, Glen Sherman and Ron Turkosz got singles.

Ian Duff of Ballinacraig and Steve Wilson scored three goals apiece against Orillia. George Artem connected twice and Bruce Cooksley, Jim Chisholm, Glen Sherman and Del Watson lit the lamp once each.

In Monday night's game Jim Chisholm led the Ram attack with four goals. Bruce Cooksley and Kevin Marcoux netted three each, Steve Wilson and Glen Sherman two each and Wayne Young and George Artem one apiece. Goalie Gary Turkosz earned assists on six goals, bringing his assists total for the three games to nine.

Burlington Kinsmen relied heavily on aid from the northern part of the Halton Region, as they posted a 6-1 record to win the Canadian junior girls' softball championship in the National Tournament they hosted in Burlington on the holiday weekend.

Sue Thomson, the 16 year old pitching star from Brookville joined Kinsmen for the

tournament and played a large role in the victory, as she pitched a 3-1 win over Prince Edward Island, beat B.C. 3-2 in extra innings in a crucial game Sunday and turned in fine relief jobs in two other games in a 7-1 conquest of Alberta and 9-6 win over B.C. in the championship game Monday.

In recognition of her efforts Sue was selected to the

tournament all-star team as pitcher and presented with a handsome trophy.

Many of Sue's teammates on both the Brookville Selects junior team and Brookville 16 and under girls were on hand to cheer the Kinsmen to victory. Last year Sue travelled to B.C. with the Kitchener Civitan Juniors who represented Ontario in the Canada Games.

Kinsmen, who finished first in the Southern Ontario League gained a berth in the Canadian championships as the host team, even though they had been eliminated in the Ontario championships. Milverton represented Ontario in the event. Brookville Selects placed fourth in the Southern Ontario League. Burlington defeated Manitoba 10-0 and Alberta 7-1 and lost to B.C. 4-3 Saturday. On Sunday they topped PEI 3-1, Ontario 4-2 and B.C. 3-2. They posted a 9-6 win over B.C. in Monday's championship game against the hard-hitting west coast crew.

Besides Burlington, there were entries from Prince Edward Island, Manitoba, Alberta, Ontario, Saskatchewan, Quebec, B.C. and the North West Territories.
