A station wagon quietly pulled into the Rockwood Academy Friday, July 26, and left with a large object. Another piece of unique sculpture created by Rockwood's own special artist, Yosef Drenters has left the village to grace some area of the Sarnia Public Library and Art Gallery.

Halton Region wants to join the Metropolitan Toronto Industrial Commission, at an annual Membership fee of \$10,000--but not until 1975. That's the recommendation approved on a 2-1 vote last week after the region's Finance and Administration Committee reviewed--for the third time--the possibility of joining MTIC. Some members were all for joining right away but some eyed the cost in light of the region's desire to chop the 1974 budget and spoke in favor of delaying membership until next January.

Only Councillor Paul Preston of Burlington opposed the move. He said he wanted more study and wanted to hear opinions from the two full time industrial commissioners in Halton, Ron Cookley of Oakville and Gordon Blair of Burlington. MTIC has done work with Georgetown and Oakville in the past but no other Halton municipalities were members. Oakville Councillor MacLean Anderson told the committee he could name at least 30 industries that located in Oakville after assistance from the Metro Commission, working in cooperation with Oakville's industrial commissioner. "These people have a proven record, and their contacts are tremendous. Our competition is absolutely vicious," he said.
