Halton's prettiest farms, homes win competition

Owners of 15 rural homes and farmsteads in Halton received \$50 prizes Wednesday when winners of the Halton Farmstead and Rural Home Improvement competition were announced. The contest was sponsored by the Halton Local Committee for the International Plowing Match, an effort to "spruce up" the farms and rural homes in the region.

"We want everyone in Halton to tidy up and beautify their property, so people will see the best side of Halton when they visit the IPM in September," contest committee chairman Gerald Carlton said. About 200,000 visitors are expected at the Sept. 24 to 28 plowing match in Halton Hills, just south of Georgetown.

Close to 200 people attended the wind-up banquet and awards night at Ontario School for the Deaf Wednesday. All 130 entrants in the contest were invited, along with IPM officials.

Visited twice

The contest was divided into three categories—farmsteads, rural homes, and farmsteads which have already been improved. Entrants in the first two categories were visited by Judge R.E. Goodin of Oakville last summer, then he visited them again this summer to see how much they had improved their appearance of their properties. The farmsteads already improved were just visited once.

Winner of the farmstead section was Brock Harris of Walker's Line, R.R. 6, Milton. Second prize went to Bill Gregg, R.R. 2, Rockwood, while third to fifth prizes went to Fred Nurse, R.R. 2, Georgetown, Peter VanderDussen, R.R. 2, Hornby and Casey Boss, R.R. 4, Acton.

Rural home winner was Joseph Bonanno, R.R. 2, Georgetown. Second place in this class went to David Moffat, R.R. 3, Georgetown. Third to fifth prizes were G.H. Fish, R.R. 2, Campbellville, Keith Copeland, R.R. 2, Milton, and Edward Doyle, R.R. 3, Georgetown.

Best of the improved farmsteads was that of Ford Wickson, Seventh Line, R.R. 2, Georgetown. Second in this class went to Limestone Hall Farms, R.R. 2, Milton, while third was H.C. Reid, R.R. 6, Milton, fourth Reford Gardner, R.R. 4, Milton, and fifth Gordon McDonald, R.R. 3, Georgetown.

Special award

Judge Goodin reported there were 60 farmsteads, 46 rural homes and 23 improved farmsteads entered in the contest. One entrant, whose rural home improvement efforts deserved a prize, withdrew for personal reasons.

The judge also awarded a special prize, a watering can, to Halton's agricultural representative Henry J. Stanley for what he called "The best garden in Halton."

Judge Goodin showed slides of many of the contest entries, before and after the improvements, and remarked he was very satisfied to see the changes people made.

First prize winners received a cheque for \$50 plus a silver tea service, donated by Simpson's. Mrs. Gail Kendall, daughter of Simpson's president G. Alan Burton made the presentations. First and second prize winners will also receive a colored aerial photograph of their property, donated by Glen Eaton. Third to fifth prizes brought \$50 cash awards.

All winners plaque

All entrants in the contest received a plaque as well. More than half the entries were from the Esquesing area of Halton, where the match will be staged, officials report.

Guest speaker at the banquet was Art Peppin, assistant director of the agricultural and horticultural societies branch—Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food. He suggested the competition was one of the greatest assets that evolved from an international plowing match, as it means lasting improvements to the rural properties.

The contest is sponsored by the local committee and the city has been rented, leaving only 3,000 feet to go. "Everything is proceeding on schedule," he said, "and all the pieces of this giant jigsaw puzzle are falling into place."

The banquet was served by St. George's Anglican Church, Lowville. Twins Cindy and Sandy Higgins of Milton entertained with accordion music. Guests introduced included OPA president Len Jefferson, Halton's OPA director Jack Taylor, Queen of the Furrow Carol Somerville, Dairy Princess Joyce Wilson, Local Committee chairman Ross Segawa and members of the sponsoring committee.

Those competitors who did not attend the banquet can pick up their plaques from the Ministry of Agriculture and Food office in Milton.
