Minor hockey adopts training

"If we can get our players fit before the season begins, we can spend our ice time sessions teaching skills and once the kids are learning something, they'll enjoy hockey that much more,' President Noel Weir explained.

He said he hopes some teams can begin working out on dry land as early as September 15. Registration for hockey is being held in early

"We're more interested in having players come out to learn than in building superstars," President Weir concluded.

The President emphasized that all new coaches in the organization will be expected to follow the new program.




