Erin twp. council

At their regular meeting, September 3, Erin township council:

Read a copy of a letter from the Wellington-Dufferin Health Unit to a township resident, expressing concern over the dumping of manure near a small stream. The letter stated manure should be kept in a covered container until removed to a spot less likely to cause a pollution problem.

Received a complaint from a firm of solicitors whose clients were also concerned with the foregoing, and with the contravention of bylaws by the same resident in building a barn on a residential sized lot.

Reeve Lloyd Lang stated his concern, but said the bylaw can't be enforced until it is accepted by the O.M.B.

Survey
Were informed the Ontario Hydro will start surveying for the new power lines in the spring, the work to be completed by December, 77.

Were notified the Ministry of Transportation will begin a study of traffic control signs in the township in October.

Passed a motion to pay extra premiums of \$11 per volunteer fireman to increase Firemen's Workmen's Compensation from ten to twelve thousand per annum.

Flea market?
Spoke with a Second Line resident who was concerned over the development of what he thought might turn out to be a "flea market" in the area.

Bill Mann, Ospringe, stated "This will be extremely detrimental to the area. I feel so strongly about this, I'll fight it as hard as I can, physically and financially."

Mr. Mann told council that, to the best of his knowledge, ponds were being dug on an adjacent property even though the Conservation Authorities had issued instructions to stop; the house had been turned into a multi-dwelling building; the barn was being renovated to sell new and used furniture, and a camping area with cabins was planned.

Again, council stated they could do nothing until the bylaws were approved, but decided two council members would visit the farm to point out a commercial venture would be opposed to the present zoning bylaw.

Apartment
Granted permission to Lloyd Peavoy, Hillsburgh, to use space previously used as a store in his building to install an extra apartment. Received a letter from Consumers Gas requesting

permission to install gas in the first phase area of Hillsburgh subdivision, on Elmcrest Rd.

Were requested by an Eighth line resident, lot 15, to clean up debris in ditches and improve the culverts in the area to eliminate the washing out of drives and culverts in the spring.

Subdivisions
Were notified the O.M.B. had three applications for subdivisions under review but could only handle one. When Mrs. Bedford of the Board asked which application council would like approved, Reeve Lang commented "It's not our job to promote one particular subdivision. It's up to the O.M.B. to sort out who came first and last."

A motion was passed to notify Mrs. Bedford to that effect.

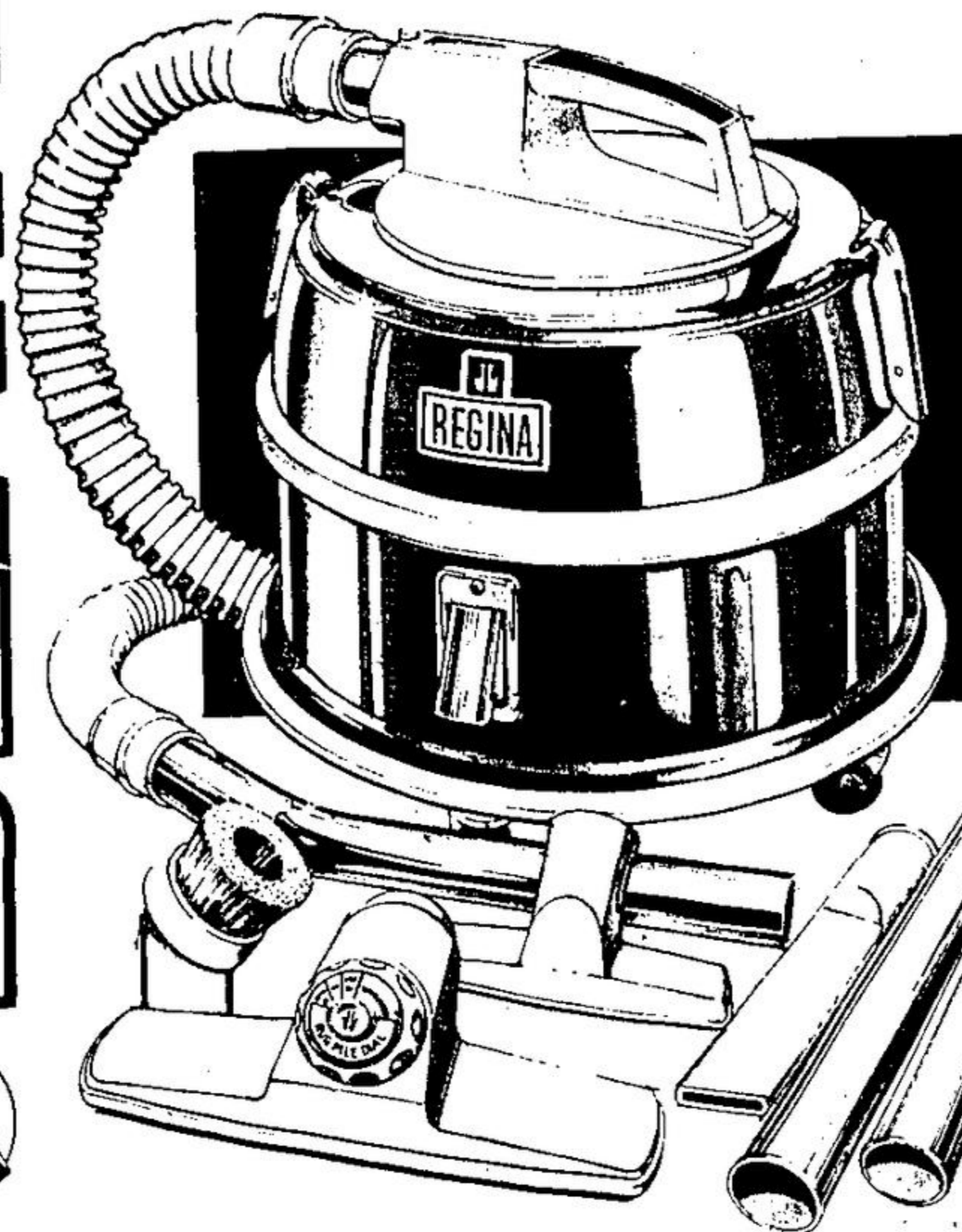
Passed a motion paying Grand River Conservation Authority the second installment of the 1974 levy, a sum of \$2,714.13.

Met with John Ellis, who asked approval to erect an extra building on his property to use as the Station Road Nursery School.

Council informed him that the zoning bylaw does not permit this, but he could appeal in the next few months when the new bylaw is circulated.

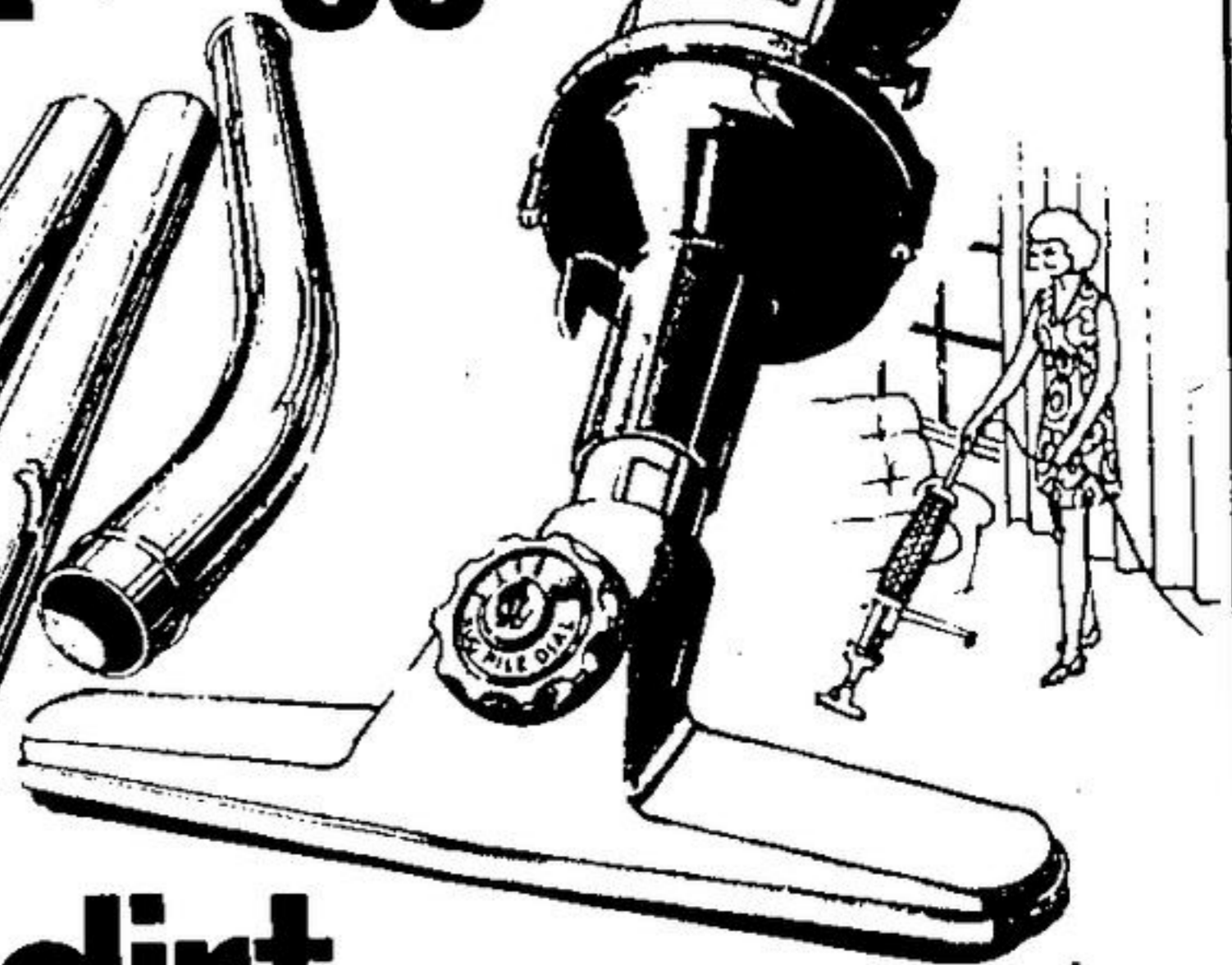

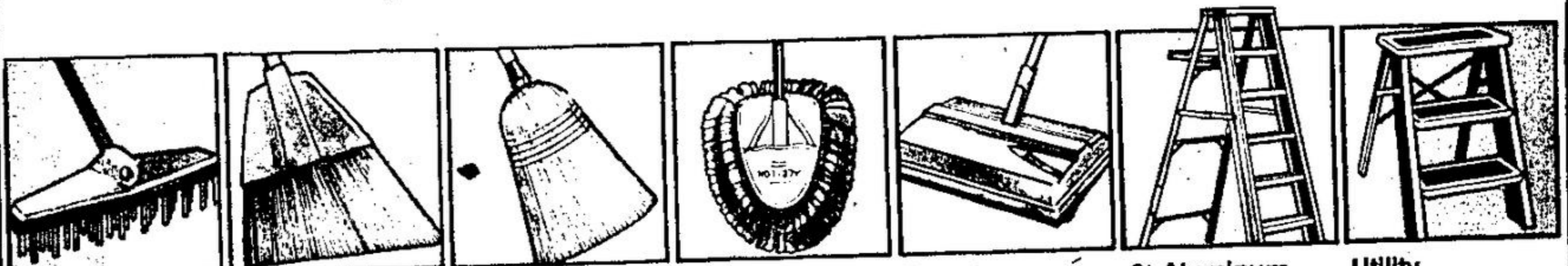

HANDYMAN TIP # 29

Cleaning
Rubber Heel Marks on vinyl floors can be removed with petroleum solvent such as McEachern Wax Stripper. Wax Build-Up. Self-polishing wax build-up can be removed with strong ammonia solution and a stiff brush. For other waxes use a solvent remover.

Black-Stained Hardwood.
Place soft cloth soaked in concentrated oxalic acid on spot until stain is gone. Stained Walls around heat registers can be cleaned with solution of trisodium phosphate (T.S.P.). Removing Cellulose Tape from walls is difficult. Try heating it with warm iron. Nail polisher remover, may then remove the adhesive.
