Happiest man in Halton today is W. A. (Bill) Johnson, the Nassagaweya resident who represents the Ontario Garbage Coalition executive. "This is a great step for us. It's wonderful, Halton has finally seen the light," he said Thursday after he was informed Halton Regional Council has taken his advice and sought a ban on non-refillable soft drink containers. That was one of eight requests he made to the council when he presented a Garbage Coalition brief a few weeks ago.

"I'm just on Cloud Nine," Johnson added.
Pleasant surprise
When Johnson gave his brief to council it was turned over to the works committee and Johnson feared it might get pigeonholed. But he was pleasantly surprised when council endorsed the soft drink container ban, even before the committee had a chance to study his brief. "I am delighted," he said.

run into a storm of opposition over its attempt to ban non-refillables—especially from the can manufacturers. But Johnson said he has heard their arguments before and the Garbage Coalition already has a brief countering them—and a copy of the OGC brief will be going to council soon.
The Nassagaweya resident said he has been invited to speak to Oakville Council this week about landfill problems and recycling of wastes. He hopes every local council in Halton will endorse the region's stand on non-refillables and make it unanimous across the region.

Johnson said he understands another councillor is already working on a motion calling for more waste paper to be recycled and re-used.
"Halton can be in the forefront, for once," summed up Johnson.
