



THREE TYPES OF PLOWING spanning a century were utilized by Ontario's Minister of Agriculture and Food William A. Stewart in pre-opening ceremonies at the International Plowing Match site Wednesday. Stewart, guest speaker at the press and exhibitors day, started with a team of Belgian horses and walking plow loaned by Bill Rayner of Milton. He plowed a pretty neat furrow, too, and drew a round of applause from over 350 people watching the ceremony. Then he stepped up onto the machine that started to take over the horse's work, a George White steam engine owned by Wilfrid Leslie of Halton Hills. On the back it drew an eight-furrow plow. And last but not least, Mr. Stewart progressed to a modern tractor, a Massey-Ferguson 1105 with rear tires as big as the minister. Helping him into the cab to draw the four-furrow plow are Ontario's Queen of the Furrow Sheila Armstrong and Halton Queen of the Furrow Carol Somerville of Acton.
