

### Erin twp. council notes

At their regular October meeting, Erin township council:

—Read a letter from the Wellington County Museum requesting material relevant to the history of the county. Maps, documents, or any other items could be either loaned, donated, or photographed for display in the new museum.

—Discussed a complaint from D. C. Heslop who was concerned over sections of road in Erin. He stated some side roads were unbelievably rough, dangerous, and damaging to cars using them.

On hearing that the Heslops were residents of only two months, one councillor quipped "He hasn't even got initiated yet!"

The matter was referred to roads superintendent Ed Barddon.

**No change**  
—Were informed by the township solicitor that there was a misunderstanding of the municipal act concerning licensing of trailers. There had been NO change. Trailers in camps could still be charged the \$20 fee.

Deputy-reeve Donald Matheson commented "Who are we to believe? We were told we must refund the money."

Clarification on the matter will be sought.

**No subdivision**  
—Received a copy of a letter from the Ministry of Housing to Flamingo Construction turning down their application for a subdivision adjacent to Erin Village. Among the reasons given, was the fact that the village was already undergoing a water shortage.

—Were granted a provisional certificate of approval for waste management disposal, until June of 1975.

—Passed a motion donating the sums of \$800 and \$150 to the Erin and Acton Agricultural Societies for the fall fairs.

—Paid the sum of \$103.10 for the death of sheep under the Livestock Protection Act.

**Save trees**  
—Discussed with Dave Harbour the redivisioning of three seventh concession building lots by Lake Roman to save a number of mature trees on the land.

Councillors decided to visit the property in question before further discussions.

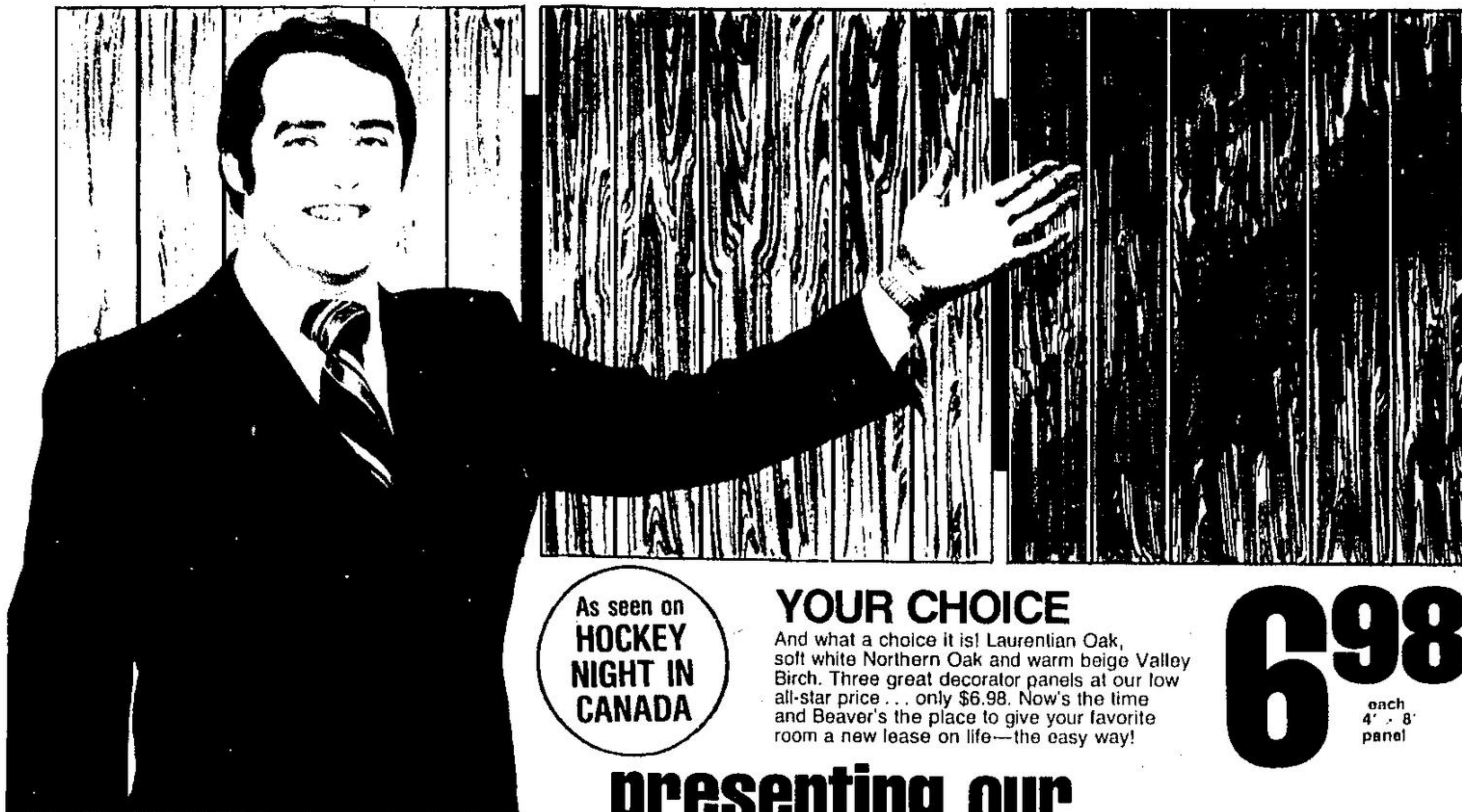

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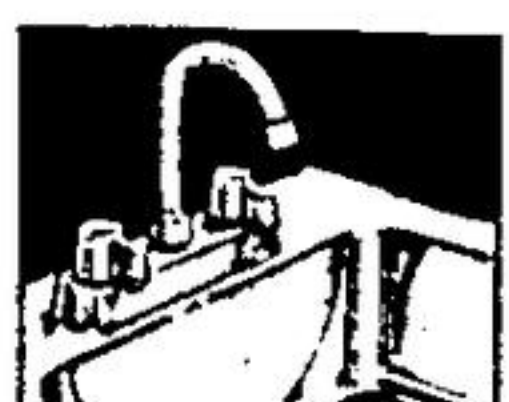
