Practice office good experience

The practice office at the high school is designed to give the students of office practice and shorthand, practical experience in putting their skills to use.

Forty girls take part in the program. Two girls are in the simulated office every morning from 8.45 to 11 a.m. While there, they type such things as study guides, plays, lessons, tests, letters, reports, and materials not funnelled through the office.

There is an agreement with the teachers that the student may miss classes, but in the case of an important lesson or a test, the girls in the office may leave to attend class.

Gain confidence
"This project gives the girls more confidence in their work when they go out looking for jobs and meeting people," explained Roy McMillan, co-ordinator of the program.

There are 17 grade 12 students taking turns in the office this semester. After Christmas, the grade 11 office practice and shorthand students will be taking part.

The different departments in the school keep the girls busy. "I like it because you get variety and I need the practice in typing," commented Donna Durby, one of the students involved.

The work the girls do in the office does not affect their classroom mark. This can be to the student's advantage if she does a poor job in the office, or disadvantage if she does a good job out of class and poor one in class.

It is hoped the practice office will be extended to full days, thus making it a more intrinsic part of the course.
