### Practice office good experience The practice office at the high school is designed to give the students of office practice and shorthand, practical experience in putting their skills to use.

Forty girls take part in the program. Two girls are in the simulated office every morning from 8.45 to 11 a.m. While there, they type such things as study guides, plays, lessons, tests, letters, reports, and materials not funnelled through the office.

There is an agreement with the teachers that the student may miss classes, but in the case of an important lesson or a test, the girls in the office may leave to attend class.




