Cliff Pady, promotion specialist, field services department of the Ontario Credit Union, attended the meeting with Halton Hills credit union manager Brendan Ahearne. Mr. Pady explained the credit union formerly called the Acton Credit Union, is expanding its territory to include Georgetown. He had had a favorable response from Georgetown Industries to his requests to include literature with pay cheques.
