Surveying activity arouses interest

Intensified surveying activity on Highway 7 between Acton and Guelph for the last two months has aroused curiosity of many drivers who travel that portion of the road regularly.

Ed Stevenson, project manager of the London regional office of the Ministry of Transportation and Communications, explains that the department is in the planning stage of a five year construction program which could begin anytime within the next five years.

According to the spokesman, the existing highway is in line for up grading to be brought up to a better 50 m.p.h. standard. "This means we will be improving the road by improving the grades, taking off bad crest curves, making two or three revisions to horizontal bends," he said.

Mr. Stevenson was referring to sharp and winding curves on the highway as it now stands. He said the existing road will be widened to 24 feet of pavement with eight foot shoulders. "Improvements will be made wherever it is warranted by traffic," he explained. He added that intersections will also be improved between Acton and Guelph. "We are looking at the intersections on Highways 7 and 25 in Acton and re-alignment and a flatter curve at the intersection one mile south of Lockwood and the County Rd.," he said.

\$2,000 damage

On Oct. 19 a single car accident on Concession 3-4 in Francona township resulted in minor injury to the driver Ronald Benjamin of R.R. 3, Lockwood. The Benjamin car was travelling west when it swerved into the north ditch to avoid a cat.

Damage to the car was estimated at \$2,000.

Study first before GO raises fare

Commuters who use GO trains from Georgetown won't have to bound their noses for a raise to compensate for increased fares, at least not yet.

"We are faced with the same inflation as everyone else is so there will obviously be a rate increase someday. There won't be an increase in the immediate future though," Tom Henry of GO Transit, said last week.

He says before any rate increase there will have to be a study and GO hasn't even thought of setting one up yet.

"All we are doing so far is keeping up our normal day to day examination of revenues," Henry remarked.

Henry noted GO is budgeted to run at a deficit of around three million dollars and hit that mark last year.

"We had an increase of about 10 percent in 1972 but nothing in the last two and a half years. Inflation has now eaten most of it up," he added.

Planning seminar

Full council and heads of departments met together all afternoon last Thursday to talk only about planning. Those attending hoped to come to an opinion on where and how the future growth will come.

The meeting was closed to the press and public.

Glen cemetery vandalized

Halton Hills Mayor Tom Hill is very worried about a recent case of vandalism at the Glen Williams cemetery.

Last Friday night 17 grave stones were knocked off their base and one was broken.

"This is very expensive for the cemetery and I just wonder what will happen to other property when something like this happens on consecrated land," the mayor said. Mayor Hill is also chairman of the Glen Williams cemetery board.

He noted the repairs will badly drain the cemetery's meager assets.

"They must have been very sick people to do something like this," Hill charged.

Milton O.P.P. are investigating the incident.
