

Sabres top Cougars but bow to Bears

Gary Turkosz, the team's all-time scoring leader fired three goals Friday night to lead Acton Sabres to a 7-4 win over the Schomberg Cougars in the opening game of the Mid-Ontario Junior "C" hockey season.

Sabres travelled to Bracebridge Sunday afternoon where they dropped a tough 4-3 decision to Danny Poland's Bears after leading 3-2 at the end of the second period. Acton outplayed the visiting Cougars Friday, but found themselves in a 4-4 deadlock when Schomberg best rookie goaltender Robin Insoce twice in the first minute of the third period. Turkosz then fired the winner to complete his hat trick and Charlie McTae and Russ Van Fleet led the win with insurance goals.

It was the second marker of the night for Van Fleet, another Sabre rookie and one of four members of the 1967-68 Acton I.G.A. novice zone championship team who have now worked their way up to

play junior hockey for their town. Insoce, defenceman Steve Brunelle and rearguard Kent Kentner who is on the injured list are the others.

Bob Ingills scored the other Acton goal. McTae had a goal and four assists.

Doug Westover had a pair of goals for Schomberg. Steve Thompson and Don Smith netted one each.

Play was chippy in the third period and quick action by the linesmen prevented what could have been a rash of fights.
