ALL HALTON INVOLVED IN TRANSIT AUTHORITY

Halton's inclusion in Toronto Area Transit Operating Authority will have implications for all of Halton including the two northern municipalities, according to Halton Regional Chairman Allan Masson.

Masson noted the whole exercise was to encourage greater use of public transit and provide safe, quick service for commuters. He is the regional representative on the Authority.

Masson noted a GO train terminal existed in Georgetown now and there was a possibility of extending the service to Acton and maybe even Guelph in the future.

Halton Hills workmen are making improvements this week to No. 25 highway at Agnes St. A new guard rail is being installed on the east side and the existing guard-rail on the other side repaired.

Road shouldering work and sweeping are also underway this week.

Wallace and Hufnagel Sts. are due for asphaltting in the industrial park, according to the Halton Hills works department.

Ban hunting move fails

Efforts to ban hunting in Milton fell by the wayside Monday night. Councilors Rick Day and Russ Powadiuk launched strong appeals to have the town ban all hunting within the town limits.

Both pictured hunters as irresponsible individuals shooting at everything they saw and in some cases, shooting at sounds. Day said the killing of animals for pleasure was archaic. He claimed that if it was a walk in the bush the hunters were really interested in, they should take cameras. "But no, they like the noise and flash.
