The steady play of rookie goalies Robin Inscow and Ray Dunbar in the first four Sabre league games has created a pleasant problem for coach Dave McKnight. Rick Tomkinson, who performed brilliantly here last year quit the Junior "B" Milton Flyers Sunday and showed up for a Sabre practice Monday night. The problem is that Sabres now can't find an opening for one of last season's most valuable players.

Sabres have not succeeded in prying defenceman Larry Peterson away from Georgetown juveniles. Peterson also started the season with the Milton Flyers, but is now back home busting the cords of Tricounty nets with his slapshot, one of the hardest in the area. Sabres had hoped to use Peterson as a replacement for rookie Kent Kentner who broke his leg playing volleyball. Juvenile Ken Withers did an outstanding job filling in on the Sabre defence in the weekend series against Huntsville.

Bradford Vaseys, who play here Friday night won their first four league games easily, but stumbled in Stayner Monday night where they went down 4-3 at the hands of the Siskins. Bradford manager Bruce Collings reports the "Big Blue" are solid in goal with both John "Moose" Mulzeaar and Bernie Killoran back in uniform, but are a much younger team overall than past Vasey clubs.

There will be no intermediate hockey in Acton this winter. OHA convener Jim King of Guelph told me this week Acton filed an entry with the OHA but failed to have representation at a group meeting in Harriston. A 10 team Intermediate "C" league has been formed with entries from Harriston, Milverton, Mitchell, Seaford, Goderich, Clinton, Kincardine, Port Elgin, Lucknow and Fergus. Acton organizer Fred Buchanan hoped the OHA would accept a local team as a bye entry and as a result booked no ice time for the first part of the season. The OHA will accept bye teams, but insists clubs play in groups if they are available.

AHS win streak ends at OTHS

Acton High junior girls finally lost a game in the Halton East high schools basketball conference. After eight straight conference victories, the AHS girls were stopped 22-17 by Oakville-Trafalgar last Tuesday. Acton maintained their league lead however, as they improved their record to 10-1 with a 29-27 triple overtime win over Milton Thursday and a 26-15 triumph over the White Oaks Wildkittens here yesterday (Tuesday). The girls will play the Perdue Pantherettes in their final regular season game here Tuesday, November 19, then prepare for the playoffs, probably against a Burlington school. Sue Thomson scored six points, Karen Chapman and Maria Pataky four each and Sue Lehn three against OTHS. Against Milton Sue had a big day with 18 of the 29 Acton points. Sue Lehn added seven, Jean Shortill two and Karen Chapman and Kim Van Der Eyken one apiece. Maria Pataky hooped 10 points in the win over White Oaks. Sue Thomson scored eight, and Heather Reed and Sue Lehn four each. Sue Thomson leads the team in scoring with a 12.3 points per game average. Maria Pataky has a 10.8 average.
