### Firefighters blank Erin

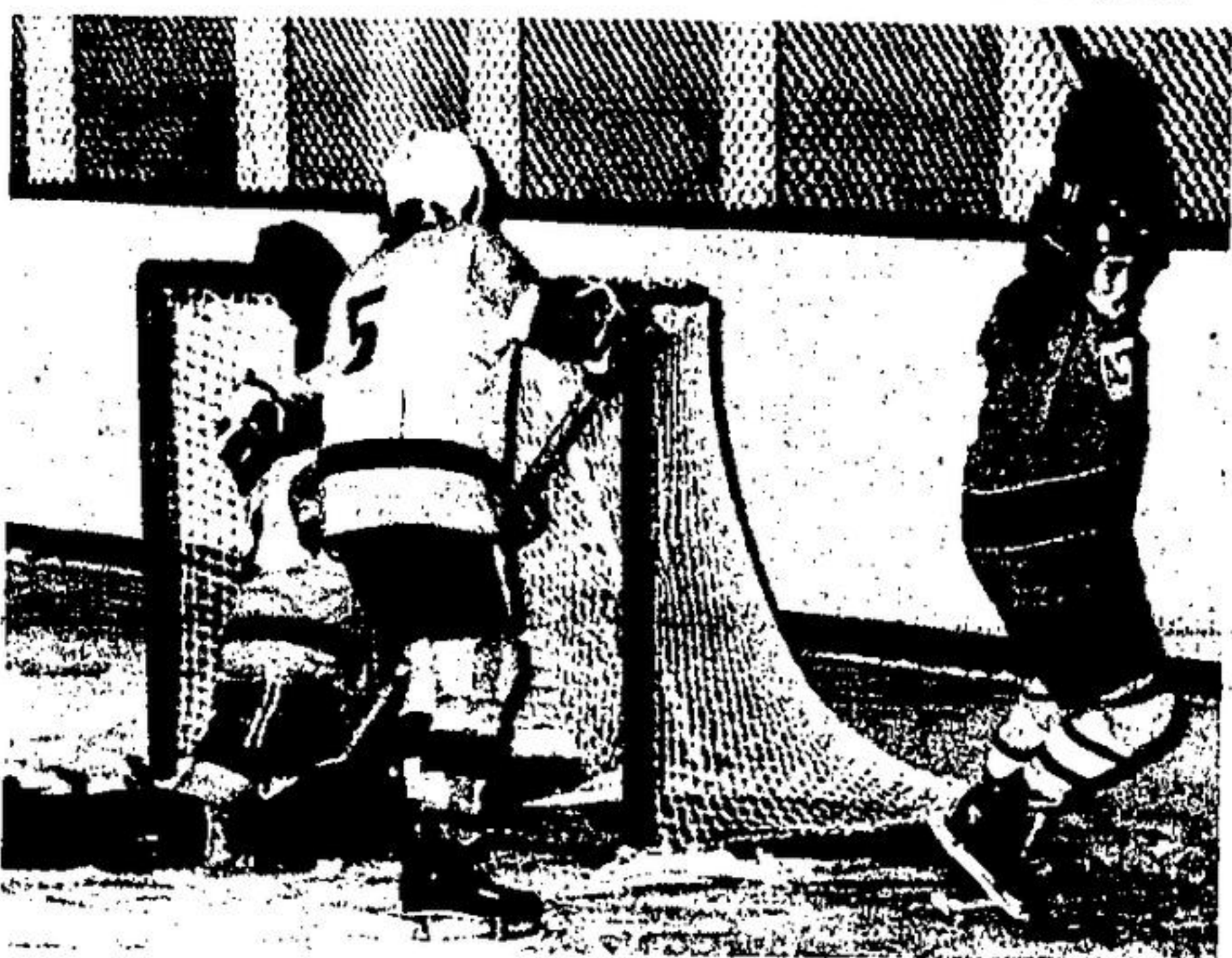
