## Planners oppose new hydro line

The proposed 500 Kv route through Halton will not receive endorsement from Halton Region's Planning Committee. Members of the committee agreed there was very little they could do about having the route changed, but refused to sanction the action. The committee expressed stiff opposition to the route as it affects Halton.

The report calls for pole towers to replace lattice towers north of Highway 401 where the line is highly visible. The pole towers are less dominating but more expensive.

The report also suggests the town of Milton assess the route with respect to the proposed industrial area immediately north of Highway 401 and to future proposed urban development in the block of land between the Milton Transformer Station and the easterly boundary of the town as well as in connection with industrially designated lands north of Highway 401.

## Donna Ledger returns new facet of career

Sunnyside Farm is a new riding stable in the area but its instructor isn't. Donna Ledger is well-known in Acton horse circles as a professional equestrian.

Last spring Donna left Ontario for a riding career in Nova Scotia, taking her horses with her. Now she's back helping Roger and Lorraine Johnston start a stable of their own. The farm is situated on the corner of Hwy. 25 and 5 sideroad of Erin, just north of Acton.

The Johnstons moved north in June from their previous residence on the Nassagaweyo-Esquering Town Line. The large barn lent itself to renovation and Roger, a Sheridan College psychology teacher, proceeded to build several box stalls, to house his own four horses.

By then, Donna was back in the country looking for a place to board her three horses.

"When Donna brought her horses here," says Roger, "we decided to capitalize on it and start a riding school."

With four of five school horses, a collection of English saddles, some enthusiastic students, Donna and the Johnstons are doing just that. Roger is quick to explain this is a project of Lorraine's, who is the school's business manager. Additional help comes from the Johnston girls, Sharrn 11, Lynn 10, and Heather 6.

Instructor  
A career in riding instruction is not a first venture for Donna who started riding at the age of 16. Babs Ellis, a former Rockwood resident, was Donna's first teacher using horses belonging to the late Bill Hatch.

In 1964, Donna travelled to England to study for her British Horse Society Assistant Instructor's certificate. On returning to Canada she spent three years teaching at the Eglington Equestrian Club. The next job was being in charge of the riding program at Edgchill Girls School, Nova Scotia.

By this time Donna was residing in Erin and doing some serious showing while training several young horses.

Enthusiasm  
Schooling English horses is actually what Donna really enjoys and she hopes to be able to indulge this enthusiasm at Sunnyside farm—with the Johnstons' blessing.

With a dearth of riding centers in the area, Sunnyside Farm is a welcome newcomer.
