The OHA has decided to clamp down on the flagrant violation of rules by teams who are using players not registered on CAHA cards.

In a press release issued this week, OHA Secretary Dave Branch announced that effective Monday, December 9 the OHA executive will uphold any protest against a team using a player, who is not registered with that team.

In the past it has sometimes taken more than the proverbial "Philadelphia lawyer" to force the OHA to take action against cheating teams. This week's announcement represents a definite change in policy and indicates that "Old Hatpin Annie" means business.

OHA rules insist that players be signed before they take part in any league game. There are adequate provisions for tryouts for imports, releases, special player assistance, etc., after
