By-law 89-74 **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This By-law will amend Restricted Area By-law 46-74 which is a by-law to amend the Restricted Area By-law of the former Township of Nassagawaya, being Zoning By-law No. 11-67, as amended.

By-law No. 46-74 was passed by the Corporation of the Town of Millon on the 6th day of May, 1974.

This By-law proposed to regulate the open air recreational uses allowed within the Rural "A" designated area in the existing zoning by-law so as to prohibit commercial recreation uses, tourist trailer parks and camp sites and driving tracks or ranges for motorized vehicles. The by-law exempted certain existing open air recreational uses from the aforesaid in order to assure their conformity with the new land use regulations. In addition, the by-law re-enacted the set-back provisions for obnoxious uses.

The reason for the by-law was the requirement to implement a planning tool that would protect existing uses within this zone provision white still not completely prohibiting the open air recreational use within the Rural "A" Zone.

By-law 46-74 was publicly advertised in conjunction with the rules of the Ontario Municipal Board providing for such matters. The following is the text of By-law 46-74:

Paragraph 2 of By-law 89-74 exempts the properties designated therein from the provisions of the By-law as they pertain to such properties.
