Receives designation

Larry N. Kistner of Nelson Court, Acton, received his R.I.A. (Registered Industrial Accountant) designation at the recent convocation of The Society of Industrial Accountants of Ontario.

Mr. Kistner is accounting manager at ITT Canada Limited in Guelph. The five-year R.I.A. program in management accounting is available by evening lecture or correspondence. It includes courses in data processing, organizational behavior, economics, management processes and problems, statistics and business law, as well as the core accounting subjects.

It is the only education program exclusively concerned with management accounting. Graduates are entitled to use the initials R.I.A. after their name.

Accounting, payroll removed from Manor

General accounting and payroll functions now carried out at Halton Centennial Manor will be transferred to Halton Regional headquarters.

Regional Council reversed a committee recommendation and adopted a report by treasurer Don Farmer urging that the responsibility be transferred to the regional treasury department.

Community Service Committee members had said there was no need for such a move as the function

was being carried on efficiently at the Manor.

In the bill But council felt the move was in keeping with Bill 151 and some members argued it should never have been put before council.

Some argued Chief Administrative Officer Ernie Reid should have dealt with the matter at the staff level.

Manor Administrator Stan Allen opposed the change, noting the work would likely be placed in a low position on

Farmer's priority list but was of great importance to the Manor.

The change will not cause a reduction in staff at the Manor or an increase at the treasury department, Farmer said.

Const. Willmott is originally from Strathroy but spent more than six years as a motorcycle policeman in Downsview OPP detachment. From there he went to Milton, where he spent two years, before being transferred here.
