These men, working for the Ministry of the Environment's Central Region surface water group, are carrying out a complete environmental assessment of the lake.

Midland Park Lake, or Little Lake, as some call it, is a small, shallow lake within the town. The lake, because of its location, sandy bottom and shoreline, has a substantial recreation use. The north and east sides boast a public beach, a trailer park, cottages and several permanent residences. The south and west ends are basically undeveloped.

Council worried The Council for the Town of Midland has been concerned about the water quality of the lake, and specifically about the possibility that proposed development in the area may result in degraded water quality conditions. There are already two storm sewers

At the request of the Town Council, the Ministry agreed to carry out a study, during 1974 to provide advice.

flowing into the lake.

To obtain a general assessment of the ecology of the lake, basic physical-chemical and biological information is collected every three weeks. Four locations are sampled-

phorus, turbidity, temperature. transparency, chlorophyll, phytoplankton and bacteria. The density and species composition of the aquatic weeds are also mapped. Management plan The Ministry of Natural Resources has agreed to

carry out a brief investigation of the fish population in order to "round out" the ecological assessment. The end result of the study will be a management plan


