**Portugal's New Year**  
 In the Minho, in northwestern Portugal, masked children go around from house to house between New Year's Eve and Epiphany. They sing janiers, ancient "January" songs. The Janeiros, as the singers are called, sometimes improvise verses about the householders. When their presents are generous, they praise them. If the gifts are few, the performers make sure the whole neighborhood hears about it.  
 There are many wise sayings in the Minho about the first day of the year. Since New Year's Day supposedly reflects the mood of the next twelve months, one should always have a coin in the pocket, something new on the back, and extra food in the larder. Parents urge their children to "mind their manners" and adults try to act as they wish to act throughout the year. Portugal has a proverb, "Never pay a debt on New Year's Day!"
