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### Petition to Bell Canada urges better service

(854) exchange Bell Canada Chairman of G.U.A.R.D. subscribers, hoping to con-vince Bell that Campbellville patrons should have the same calling privileges as the customers in Milton do.

"Bell's boundaries should be the same as municipal boundaries," the R.R. 2, Rockwood resident told this newspaper. "It's even long distance to call my councillor, Russ Powndiuk."

Johnson points out that Campbellville customers have only toll-free calling to the people on the Milton (878) exchange. But Milton can call Georgetown, Oakville and Burlington phones toll-free and later this year will have toll-free calling to Acton as well. Campbellville patrons won't be allowed no-charge calls to Acton either.

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
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
