To make it easy to visit farmers

A traffic study for Halton Region estimated to cost in the vicinity of a quarter of a million dollars won the approval of Halton Regional Planning Committee Tuesday.

Planning Director Ed Cumming indicated the traffic study was necessary and would form the basis for many of the decisions the region would be making concerning road improvements and construction.

Milton Councillor Jim Watson opposed the expenditure, noting all the region seemed to do was study and spent all kinds of money doing it.

He asked what good the study would be. Oakville Councillor Archie Donaghy said it could indicate the best system for connecting links and improve north-south and east-west transportation routes as well.

"It will make it easier for you to get to Oakville Harbor and me to get to the farms up north," Donaghy explained.

"I don't want to make it easier for you to get to the farms," Watson snapped, obviously not impressed with the explanation.

Halton Hills Councillor Ric Morrow argued the study could prevent an investment of millions of dollars in the wrong project. The committee recommended council authorize the expenditure and the study.
