Legion peewees host 6th annual tourney

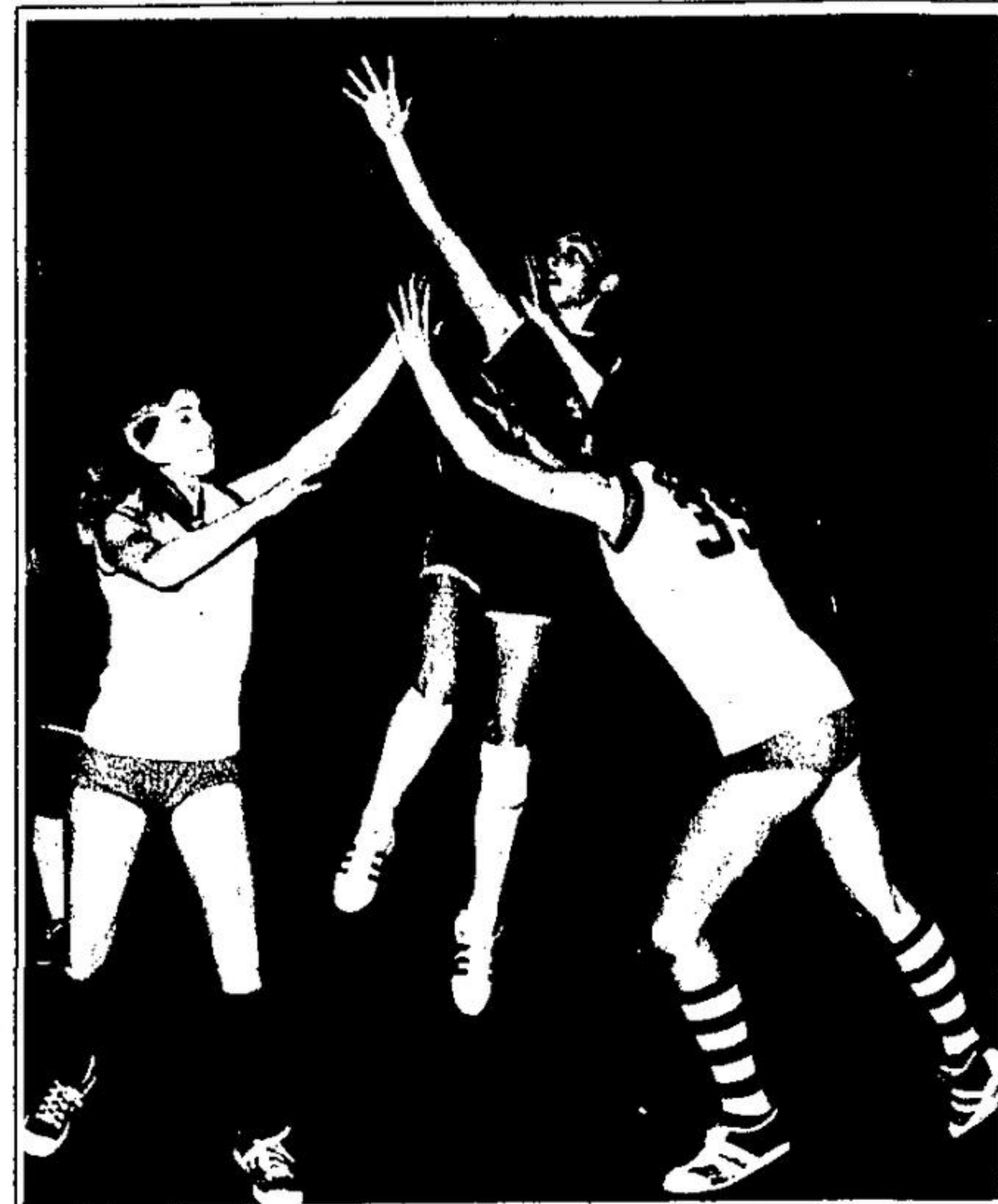
