Town charges for copying

Making copies is costly
business for the town of
Halton Hills. In an attempt to
cut the cost council passed a
bylaw Tuesday night setting
the price of copies.

A letter size page will cost
25 cents, a legal size 35 cents.
This will go for all bylaws no
matter how long.

Copies of Esqueusing's
Official plan cost twice as
much as Georgetown's or
Acton's, simply because it is
thicker.

Esqueusing copies are \$10
each, while Georgetown and
Acton's are five dollars each.

Maps of the area sell for
one dollar.

The press has been
exempted from paying for
copies of bylaws. At the
urging of Councillor Pat
McKenzie who claimed the
press should have copies in
the interest of serving the
public, council agreed to let
the press have the bylaw
copies for nothing.

New degree of M. Div.

Condominium in question

Third reading of a bylaw,
officially setting up part of
Kingham Hill Estates in
Acton under the Con-
dominium Act was held up,
Tuesday night at the request
of Councillor Ric Morrow.

He claimed there had been
problems in Georgetown with
garbage collection and felt
there should be details
worked out before the final
reading.

Morrow suggested the town
should investigate the in-
creasing number of units sold
as condominiums, claiming
rental accommodation was
being taken off the market.
He said he was not sure
whether condominiums were
beneficial to the community
as a whole.

Councillor Les Duby
pointed out this was a com-
pleted development.

Councillor Joe Hurst said
this plan was presented as a
condominium from the
beginning.

Councillor Harry Levy felt
Morrow's statement was
worthy of consideration for
future development.
