Rush light

The rush light pre-dates the candle. This example dates from about 1810, has a base of cedar and an iron pincer mounted in the base. Rushes were collected and woven into braids and mounted as shown. The rush braid was soaked in grease or fat and lit where the pincer is holding the rush. Lighting progressed from the rush light to the grease lamp to the candle. We then had the kerosene lamp, then gas lights and finally electric lights. Each basic type had a number of variations. This rush light has been on loan to the museum since 1961 from Mrs. Jean Barber of Georgetown.
