The supply teachers are complaining because they haven't had a raise in a few years and say other boards gave parents more money to baby-sit chilrden during teachers' strikes than they are receiving. They say substitute teachers are in short supply in Halton because of the poor wages.

It is expected the administration council of the Halton Board will recommend more pay for the supply teachers when their report goes before trustees on March 13.
