The Bennett boys, led by captain Kevin Weir, who scored 11 goals in three games dethroned Acton Robert Little as "B" champions with a convincing 10-0 win in the final.

Kevin Weir fired five goals, Derrick Neeley two and Bruce McPhail, Nick Humeniuk and Duncan Waldie one apiece for Bennett in the 10-0 conquest of Robert Little.

Bennett scorers in a 5-2 win over Fairview were Kevin Weir with four and Derrick Neeley with one. Kevin Weir

and Bob McClure scored two apiece, as Bennett whipped Brookville 7-2. Craig Somerville, Lance Alton and Todd Cook tallied one apiece. Brookville captain, George Brown bagged both of his team's goals.

In preliminary play, Robert Little gained a 2-2 tie with Brookville and a 1-1 draw with Fairview. ## Work on arena roof forces Rams to move

Acton Rams have moved to Georgetown for at least the 1975 lacrosse season and this year the club will be known as the Halton Hills Rams.

Team president John McNabb explained the move was necessitated by the Halton Hills Council decision to proceed with installation of a new roof on the Acton arena this summer. That work is expected to begin in April, with the opening of the Junior "C" lacrosse schedule set for early May.

There is a possibility the Ram organization will help launch a minor lacrosse program in Georgetown. With minor lacrosse operating in both Acton and Georgetown and with player help from neighboring communities like

Mississauga, Ram officials feel there will be more than enough players to operate a Junior "B" team in Georgetown and a Junior "C" club in Acton at the same time.

Rams will play their home games in the old Georgetown Memorial Arena on Thursday nights, probably beginning May 15 against the Huntsville Hawks, Rexdale, Orillia, Mississauga, Orangeville and Owen Sound are also entered in the OLA's central Ontario

group. Top two finishers in the group will automatically gain berths in the Ontario Summer Games competition in London, Labor Day weekend.

Rob Pool, who will return for his second year as Ram coach is interested in looking at new prospects, whether they have played lacrosse before or not. Ram preseason workouts are being held at the Stewarttown school gym Thursday nights at 7.
