Ransom St. plan reduced

The subdivision on Ransom Street, Acton, being developed by Windland Associates, has been reduced from 17 to 16 lots.

Both requirements were asked by the town of Halton Hills. Another requirement, the widening of the radius of the turning circle to 60 feet, has also been fulfilled.

Councillor Les Duby said he was glad to see the developer had conformed with the town's request.

Halton Hills Planning Board recommended two readings be given the by-law changing the designation from open space to RZ, and instructed the solicitor to draw up an agreement.

Water for Halton Hills office holds up consolidation plans

Plans to consolidate all of the municipal offices in Halton Hills under one roof were dampened when town officials were advised the project would cost \$80,000 for water services alone.

Currently the town is administered from at least three locations. The council wants to bring the operation under one roof at the former Esqueping municipal building near Stewarttown.

Not going broke MacArthur says

"We're not going broke", Milton Mayor Anne MacArthur told a joint committee of Halton Hills and Halton Region's works committees last week.

The mayor made the statement during a discussion on the chargeback system. Mayor MacArthur has opposed moves towards equalized assessment and common water rates for the whole region.

Regional Public Works Chairman Jack Raffis said common rates and equalized assessment would come. He felt the system would work to the benefit of the smaller northern communities which don't have the population to pay for the mammoth projects that are required.

Civiero lots approved

Gino Civiero of Civiero Construction Co. was allowed by Halton Hills Committee of Adjustment to reduce the frontage of two lots on the First Line and Highway Seven, on the west side of Acton, from 125 feet to 100 feet.

Mr. Civiero told the committee he intended to build one house for himself and the other to sell. He said he bought the land in 1964.

The committee approved the minor variance, saying the lots met all the sewage restrictions and no objections were received from surrounding neighbors.

wants to bring in town water to the building. The water currently being used is of a poor quality. The town had considered bringing water in from Maple Ave. and Councillor Mike Armstrong recalled the cost of that project being projected at about \$40,000.

During a meeting of the regional works committee and the Halton Hills works committee Wednesday night, regional engineer Ray Cripps told the committees the price

had been updated to reflect increased costs. The project will now cost somewhere in the area of \$80,000.

Mr. Armstrong explained the consolidation of offices was a high priority item and that can't be done until a pure water supply is provided.

Advised of the \$80,000 price tag, Mr. Armstrong suggested the matter should be referred back to the Halton Hills works committee for more consideration.

He suggested drilling a new well might prove to be a less costly solution to the problem. Chief administrative officer Ernie Reid said the project had received tentative approval at the regional level.

Water is responsibility of the region but it paid for out of the local water rate at this time. A change in policy in the chargeback system is anticipated soon.

Chairman Jack Raffis indicated the project would be paid for locally and assured the committee Halton Hills wouldn't find opposition to the project if the council decided to go ahead.

He pointed out the town could recover some of the costs if the provisions of the local improvement act were applied. If that was done the cost would be shared by those persons owning land that could be served by the new line.

No decisions were made. The matter will come up again at the Halton Hills committee.

Traffic debate Another matter discussed was a uniform traffic by-law for the region. There appeared to be some confusion about what could be done by the area, with and without regional approval.

Halton Hills is currently developing one traffic by-law for the town in an effort to have a common set of by-laws for Acton and Georgetown. Meanwhile the region is working towards one traffic by-law for the region. It is expected to be another six months before the regional by-law is ready.
