Rockwood returns to Intercounty league

"We felt we weren't experienced enough to go Intercounty and the old rivalry of the Intercounty league appeared interesting," said coach Mike Kelly, a veteran of nine seasons of senior fastball in Rockwood.

Kelly has played a dual role for the past three seasons,

playing regularly for the seniors and coaching the Rockwood Juniors. The Juniors were ORSA finalists in 1973.

"We're looking for our junior players, plus returnees like Chick Milne and Harry Phillips to make us a pennant contender," Kelly says.
