Ford layoffs continuing

Workers at the Ford plant in Oakville, many of whom will be laid off, will be laid off for the seventh time this year next month.
About 3,700 workers were informed recently they won't be working from May 5 to May 9. It will be the seventh week of layoffs at Ford this year. During the same time period last year the employees were off the job for only five weeks.
The upcoming layoff is being blamed on large inventories in the United States and a spokesman for the Oakville auto firm said no more layoffs are planned for this economic quarter.
The spokesman cautioned there could be more layoffs if car sales in the United States continue to lag. Most of Ford's Oakville production goes south of the border.
Ford officials had previously said they didn't expect there would be any layoffs in the second quarter of the year, April through June.
Most of the workers affected by the layoffs are eligible for supplementary unemployment benefits.

Contract

A \$639,409 contract has been awarded to F. Greco and Sons Limited, Rexdale, for constructing the remainder of the Ontario Agricultural Museum project at Kelsco, stage 3, for the Ministry of Agriculture and Food.
F. Greco and sons submitted the lowest of four bids received, the high being \$858,000, Halton East MPJ James Snow, Minister of Government Services said.
The contract covers provision of basic utilities and services to the 92-acre site, including underground electrical, telephone and fire alarm systems, water mains and fire hydrants, additional roads, walks and parking areas, storm drainage and landscaping. Construction of two small buildings to provide public washrooms and picnic shelter is also specified.

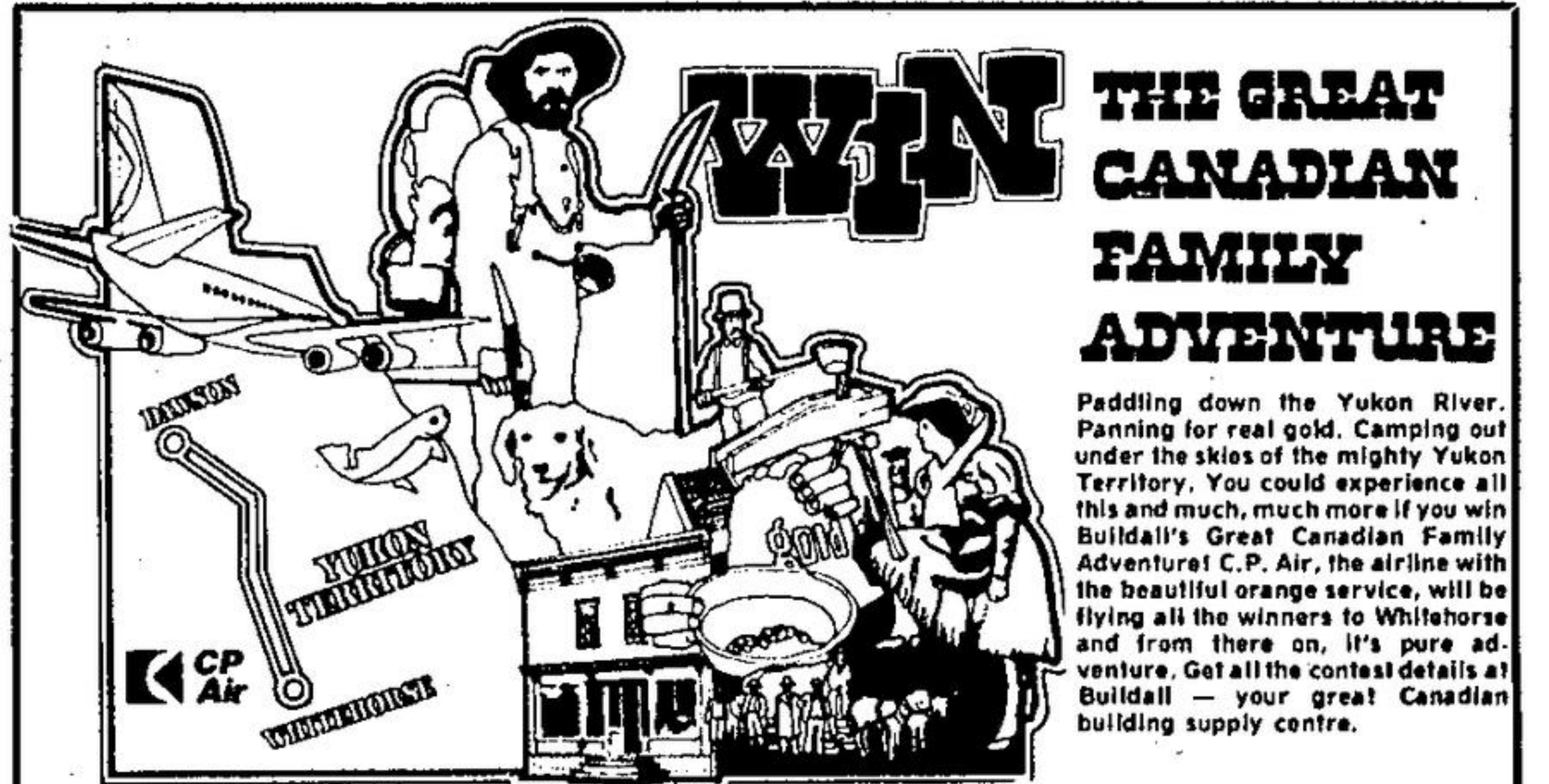

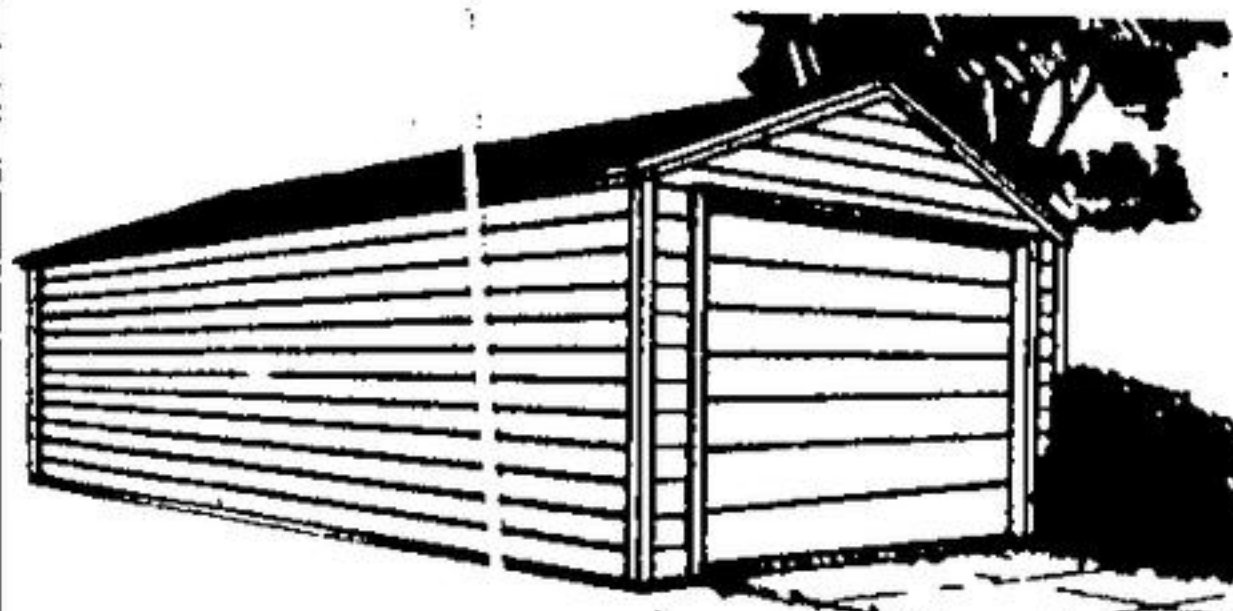

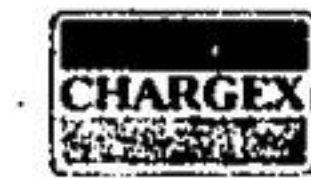
