## Search out interest in bicycle club

A meeting will be called by recreation co-ordinator John Cooper to see if local people are interested in forming a bicycle club. Advisory committee members again discussed the possibility at their meeting Thursday.

All agreed it is possible to have a bike club without special bike paths.

Brendan Ahearne declared the estimated cost of building bike paths, \$15,000 a mile, is "ridiculous". The shoulders of highways could be paved at much less cost.

He said he has written to

the Department of Highways suggesting paved shoulders for the rebuilding of Highway No. 7 between Acton and Guelph. He admits he doesn't feel there is any hope for bike paths along the shoulders.

He understands the department people believe shoulders would have to be built the same strength as the whole highway, since cars would pull off and park.

However, Mr. Ahearne thinks existing roads and highways are the most reasonable place for bikes, rather than specially-built paths. One section of highway can be marked for bikes. In some places certain streets are blocked to cars.

## Public time for tennis need

When should the general public have access to the tennis courts?

It's a new problem, and the recreation advisory committee discussed it at their meeting last Thursday. General feeling was there should be public time for non-club members, and it should be spread over the week.

However, Brendan Ahearne made a strong case for no public time at all. He felt the fees were so reasonable it would be better to have all players join, and play under club supervision.

Pam Sheldon felt there must be public time since the courts were built with "public money".

The people interested in forming a tennis club had met and also agreed there should be public time. Mr. Cooper reported. He said money is in the council budget for more fencing and lights.

Right now there is snow fencing at the side to keep bicycles and motorbikes off the courts.

Mr. Cooper thought people would move off the court in reasonable time, even if there is no supervision.
