

# Win trophies at festival

M.Z. Bennett school, Acton won five out of a possible 12 first place trophies at the North Halton Music Festival held at that school on May 7. The M.Z.B. singers were only entered in eight competitions.

Eleven schools were competing for the trophies from throughout Halton and Elaine Mason of the North York Board of Education was the adjudicator.

**Competition winners**  
M.Z. Bennett won the first competition with the class eight grades five and six category. Martin St. school Milton, placed second with Robert Little school, Acton, in third spot. The Ashgrove Women's Institute donated the first place trophy.

Winning first place in the Class one, primary choir, grades one and two, was M.Z. Bennett, earning the John Milton I.O.D.E. trophy. Robert Little placed second with Brookville school in third place.

M.Z. Bennett won another first in the class three intermediate choir, grades five and six, with Martin St. coming second. Robt Baldwin and Brookville tied for third place. The Lakeside I.O.D.E. donated the first place trophy.

M.F. Dublin W.I. trophy was given to Robert Little school for their first place prize in the class two junior choir, grades three and four. Brookville school placed second with M.Z. Bennett in third spot.

Limehouse school won a first place trophy in the class 12, triple duet, grades four, five and six, with Percy Merry in second place. A parent representative donated the first place trophy.

Glen Williams placed first in the class 11, junior choir,

grades four, five, and six with Percy Merry outside of Milton in second place. Limehouse school came in third. Scotch Brook W.I. donated the trophy to Glen Williams.

In the class 10, primary choir, grades one, two and three, Glen Williams and Limehouse tied for first place. The trophy was donated by Hornby W.I.

Fairview school received the first place trophy donated by the Acton W.I. for the class seven, boys' choir changed voices. Martin St. placed second with M.Z. Bennett in third position.

The Kenneth Harrison Memorial trophy was won by Stewarttown school for first place in the class four, Senior Choir, grades seven and eight category. Martin St. school placed second with Brookville capturing the third position.

In the class six, boys' choir unchanged voices, M.Z. Bennett earned their fourth first-place trophy in memory of former M.Z.B. principal Elmer Smith, a strong supporter of the festival. Brookville placed second and Fairview third.

Robert Little school snatched the first place honor of the class five, senior choir category. M.Z. Bennett was in second place and Fairview in third spot. The first place trophy was donated by Sybil Bennett.

In the final contest, the class nine, triple trio, grades seven and eight, M.Z. Bennett walked off with the first place position. Stewarttown placed second and Fairview third. Silverwood W.I. donated the first place trophy.

Other schools participating were Wrigglesworth school, Georgetown and Robert Baldwin, Milton.

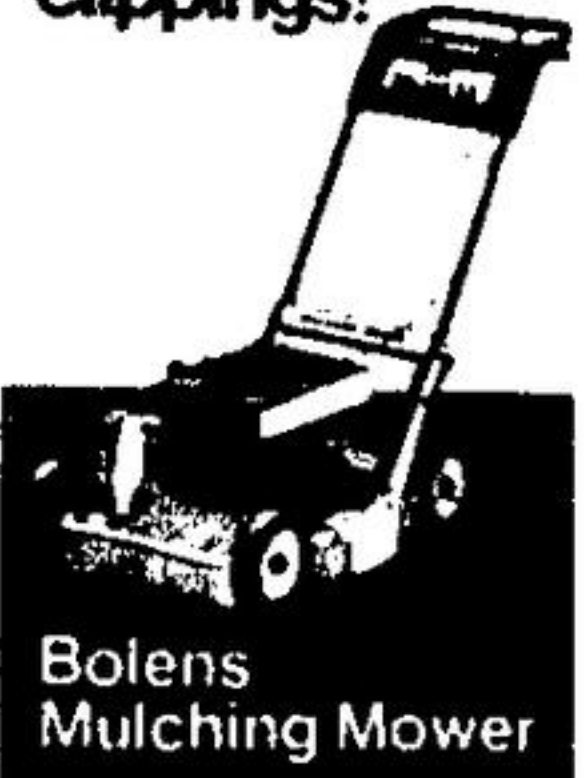
