Fireworks may be SOLD six days prior to Empire Day. May 19 and Dominion Day, July 1 excluding Sundays. Family fireworks may not be sold or given to any person under the age of 18 years. Family tireworks may be SET OFF on Empire Day, May

19 and Dominion Day, July 1 or the three days preceding

these dolidays.

Persons 18 years of older may discharge fireworks on his own property or on other private property with the consent When under 18 years of age, the person must be under the supervision of parents, guardians or other responsible persons.

Setting off of fireworks is prohibited on public land, roads, buildings, also prohibited in buildings or cars or any place where it would create a nuisance, The above statements are "without prejudice" and constitute some important interpretations or opinions of bylaw No. 69-1463 of the Corporation of the Town of Acton, which bylaw regulates the use and sale of fireworks and firecrackers within the boundaries of the town of Acton only, and now subject to the jurisdiction of the Town of Halton Hills.
