

## Peterboro Petes draft Kentner

Peterboro Petes selected 17-year-old Acton Sabre defenceman Kent Kentner in the 20th round of the OHA Major Junior "A" average midget draft held in Toronto Thursday. Kent is the first Sabre ever to be chosen in the draft.

Older son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Kentner, Kent has played all his minor hockey in Acton, since he helped the Acton novices win the OHA zone championship in 1969. In his first year of junior hockey this season, he scored four goals and picked up 79 minutes in penalties in 17 games. He'll report to the Petes' training camp in the fall.

Norm Bryan, a scout for the Petes attended several games in the Central Ontario Junior "C" league this winter.

Also drafted from the Central Ontario "C" league were Paul O'Leary of Alliston by Peterboro in the 10th round, Larry Cowan of Penetang by Hamilton in the 13th round, Marc Duquette of Penetang by St. Catharines in the 18th round and Bill Demianuk of Alliston in the 10th round.

Geoff Shaw, a talented defenceman who played for Bradford in the 1973-74 season was selected off the Toronto Nationals roster in the fourth round by Oshawa.

# Empty seats hurt more than losses

Halton Hills Rams are still looking for their first win after three tries in the OLA Central Junior "C" league, but what really has Ram officials concerned are the empty seats at the club's new home, Georgetown Memorial Arena.

Less than 100 fans showed up Thursday night to see the Rams lose 18-11 to the first place Huntsville Hawks and paid attendance was only 65 when Orangeville Stingers downed the Rams 14-10 here Monday night. Rams lost

their first league game on the road 21-13 to the Orillia Lions. Rams play in Owen Sound tomorrow (Thursday) night and don't make their next start here in Georgetown until the following Thursday, May 29 against Orillia. General manager Howard Dwyer is scratching his head for ideas on how to put some lacrosse fans in the building.

Major deterrent to fans is probably unfamiliarity with Ram players, most of whom hail from either Acton or the Metro Toronto area. There is only one Georgetown boy, Andy Broadbent in the lineup at present.

Former Victoria B.C. Junior "A" player Rick Hollingshead, last year's league scoring champ, 16-year-old Jim Meredith and Greg Sharpe combined to score 13 of the 18 Huntsville goals in Thursday's game. Hollingshead fired five goals, Meredith and Sharpe four each. Reg Hollingshead had a pair and Steve Pearce, John Beattie, and Greg Harper one apiece for the Hawks. Reg

Hollingshead also assisted on nine goals. Paul Wilson led Ram scorers with four goals. Jim Chisholm, Bill Fox, Bruce Green netted two each and Ron Turkosz one.

Huntsville took a 6-2 first period lead and were ahead 14-7 heading into the third. Monday night Orangeville Stingers, a first year club got four goals from Bob Noble, three from Ted Walker, two from Roy Bryn and one each from Stuart Sanderson, Joe Diamond, Pete Black and Randy Watts.

Ron Turkosz, who showed up late at Rams' pre-season training camp repelled five times for Halton Hills. Single goals went to Steve Wilson, Bill Fox, Andy Broadbent, George Artem and Kevin Marcoux.

Halton Hills trailed by a single goal 11-10 with three minutes to play, but Ram defenders let Stinger shooters walk right in on goalie Gary

Turkosz for goals three times in the final minutes. Coach Rob Paul remains optimistic about the season ahead, in spite of the losses. "We're not taking advantage of good scoring opportunities, our checking isn't close enough and our goaltending could improve," he said. "In short we just need more practice time."

Five year junior lacrosse veteran Gary Turkosz and returned Doug Taylor have been handling goaltending chores so far.

Jim Chisholm was suspended for two games, after picking up his second game misconduct in the third period of Thursday's game.
